



Cutting Directions


Note: Read assembly directions before cutting patches. Borders are cut to exact length required plus ¹/4" seam allowance. WOF designates the width of fabric from selvedge to selvedge (approximately 42" wide).

- Fabric ACut (40) sets of (4) Template 1
arrows for a total of 160.
Cut (3) 2 1/8" x WOF strips. Sub-cut
(40) 2 1/8" squares.
Cut (24) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut
the strips into (288) 2" x 3 1/2"
strips.
- Fabric B Cut (8) 7 ¼" x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into (40) 7 ¼" squares. Cut the squares across both diagonals to make (160) 7 ¼" triangles.
 Cut (28) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into (576) 2" squares.
- **Binding** Cut (7) 2 ¹/₂" x WOF strips for the binding.
- Backing Cut (2) 71" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together and trim to make (1) 71" x 80" backing.

Making the Quilt


1. Block Assembly

Place (1) 2" Fabric B square on the left side of (1) 2" x 3 ¹/₂" Fabric A strip, right sides together (Diagram 1). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Diagram 1). Flip open the triangle formed and press (Diagram 2). Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a ¹/₄" seam allowance.


- 2. Place another 2" Fabric B square on the right side of the 2" x 3 ¹/₂" Fabric A strip, right sides together (Diagram 3) Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Diagram 3). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a ¹/₄" seam allowance to make (1) Unit 1 strip (Diagram 4)
- 3. Repeat Steps 1-2 to make (288) Unit 1 strips total.



- Unit 1 make 288 B A B Diagram 4
- **4.** Sew (1) 7 ¹/₄" Fabric B triangle to each side of (1) Fabric A-Template 1 arrow to make the top row. Repeat to make the bottom row.
- Sew (1) Fabric A-Template 1 arrow to each side of (1) 2 ⁵/₈" Fabric A square to make the middle row.

Criss Cross

- 6. Sew the (2) rows from Steps 4-5 together to make (1) block. Trim the block to measure 9 ¹/₂" square to make (1) Unit 2 square. Diagram 5
- 7. Repeat Steps 4-6 to make (40) Unit 2 squares total.




Quilt Top Assembly

(Refer to the Quilt Layout when assembling the quilt top.)


- **8.** Sew (48) Unit 1 strips together lengthwise to make (1) Sashing Strip. Repeat to make (6) Sashing Strips total.
- **9.** Sew (8) Unit 2 squares together to make (1) Pieced Column. Repeat to make (5) Pieced Columns total.
- **10.** Sew the (6) Sashing Strips and (5) Pieced Columns together lengthwise and alternating them to make the quilt top.

Finishing the Quilt

- **11.** Layer and quilt as desired.
- 12. Sew the (7) Fabric C binding strips together, end to end with a 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.
- **13.** Bind as desired.


