

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# **Butterscotch Quilt**

Introducing Andover Fabrics new collection: **CAMEO** by Andover Fabrics Quilt designed by Janet Houts



Quilt finishes 64" x 84" 18 Star Blocks: 10" x 10" 17 Cross Blocks: 10" x 10"

What a note of tranquility this comforter-size quilt will bring to any room. The alternating original blocks combine into a pleasing patchwork of stars and crosses.

# **Cutting Directions**

**Note:** Read assembly directions before cutting patches. All measurements are cut sizes and include <sup>1</sup>/4" seam allowances. Borders are cut the exact lengths required plus <sup>1</sup>/4" seam allowances. WOF designates the width of fabric from selvedge to selvedge (approximately 43" wide).

## Fabric A

Cut (7) strips  $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF, pieced to make the following:

(2) borders 1<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" x 70<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>"

(2) borders 11/2" x 521/2"

## Fabric B

Cut (8) strips 6<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" x WOF, pieced to make the following: (2) borders 6<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" x 72<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" (2) borders 6<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" x 64<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>"

## 6 Mediums From each:

Cut (6) strips 2<sup>1</sup>⁄<sub>2</sub>" x 10<sup>1</sup>⁄<sub>2</sub>" Cut (6) strips 2<sup>1</sup>⁄<sub>2</sub>" x 6<sup>1</sup>⁄<sub>2</sub>" Cut (12) squares 3" Cut (42) squares 2<sup>1</sup>⁄<sub>2</sub>"

**6 Lights** From each: Cut (12) squares 3" Cut (36) squares 2<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>"

## Binding

Cut (8) strips  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF for binding

## Backing


Cut (2) panels 36" x 92", pieced to fit quilt top with overlap on all sides

# **Making the Quilt**

- 1. The quilt shown uses 6 different combinations of a light and medium print. Each pairing makes 3 Star Blocks and 3 Cross Blocks.
- 2. The Star Blocks use half-square triangles (HST) that finish 2" square. Use your favorite method to make HST, or follow these directions. Cut squares 3" for HST that will be trimmed after stitching. If you prefer not to trim, cut squares 2%". Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of each light 3" (2%") square (Diagram 1). Place a marked square on a medium print square, right sides together. Sew ¼" seam on each side of the marked line; cut apart on the marked line. Press open to make pieced HST, pressing seam allowances toward the medium print. Make 8 total HST from the same fabrics for each block.




- 3. Referring to the Star Block figure, arrange light and medium 2½" squares and 8 HST in 5 horizontal rows, rotating the HST as shown to form the star design. Looking through a camera or the wrong end of binoculars may help you find mistakes. Once you are satisfied with the arrangement, join the patches in rows. Press seam allowances away from the HST. Join the rows. Make 3 Star Blocks from each fabric combination, a total of 18 Star Blocks.
- 4. Hint: There are enough patches to make 18 Cross Blocks, but you only need 17. Choose the fabric combination with which you wish to make only 2 Cross Blocks. Arrange and join 5 medium and 4 light 2<sup>1</sup>⁄<sub>2</sub>" squares to make the center checkerboard in the Cross Block. Press seam allowances toward the medium print. Sew the shorter strips to the sides, and the longer strips to the top and bottom. Make 3 Cross Blocks from each fabric combination (2 from one pairing), a total of 17 Cross Blocks.
- 5. Referring to the Quilt Diagram, arrange the blocks alternately in 7 rows of 5 blocks each. Disperse the blocks across the quilt so the same fabric combination does not touch itself. Once you are satisfied with the arrangement, join the blocks into rows, and then join the rows.
- 6. Sew long Fabric A borders to the sides, and short Fabric A borders to the top and bottom. Repeat with Fabric B borders.

# **Finishing the Quilt**


7. Layer the quilt with batting and backing and baste. Quilt in the ditch around borders and block patches. Or, quilt an overall motif across the quilt. Bind to finish the quilt.
