

Introducing Andover Fabrics new collection: **CATHERINE** by Jo Morton
Quilt designed by Candy Hargrove. Quilted by Maggi Honeyman

Quilt finishes 74" x 80½"
56 Blocks: 6" x 8"

Take a traditional block and change it just enough to make it more interesting. This elongated Churn Dash block has a large center patch to let you show off not only the lovely prints, but your quilting skills as well. Quick methods to piece the block make easy work of this fun quilt.

Cutting Directions

Note: Read assembly directions before cutting patches. All measurements are cut sizes and include ¼" seam allowances. Borders are cut the exact lengths required plus ¼" seam allowances. WOF designates the width of fabric from selvedge to selvedge (approximately 42" wide).

Fabric A

Cut (2) borders 6½" x 74", cut lengthwise
Cut (2) borders 6½" x 68½", cut lengthwise

Fabric B

Cut (63) sashes 2" x 8½"
Cut (64) sashes 2" x 6½"

Fabric C

Cut (9) strips 2½" x WOF for binding
Cut (11) rectangles 3½" x 5½"

Fabric D

Cut (112) squares 2⅜" x 2⅜" for HST (read Step 1)
Cut (112) rectangles 1¼" x 5½" (read Step 2)
Cut (112) rectangles 1¼" x 3½"

Fabric E

Cut (112) squares 2⅜" x 2⅜" for HST (read Step 1)
Cut (72) cornerstones 2" x 2"
Cut (112) rectangles 1¼" x 5½" (read Step 2)
Cut (112) rectangles 1¼" x 3½"

4 Prints

From each:
Cut (11-12) rectangles 3½" x 5½"
(56 rectangles total are needed, including Fabric C)

Backing

Cut (2) panels 41" x 88", pieced to fit quilt top with overlap on all sides

Making the Quilt

1. The blocks use half-square triangles (HST) that finish 1½" square. Use your favorite method to make HST, or follow these






Diagram 1 – Make 224 HST

directions. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of each Fabric D 2⅜" square. Place a marked square on a Fabric E 2⅜" square, right sides together. Sew ¼" from the marked line on each side (Diagram 1). Cut apart on the marked line. Press open. The HST should measure 2" x 2". If it does not, adjust your stitching and pressing. Hint: You can also begin with slightly larger Fabric D and E squares, follow the directions, and trim the HST to size. Make 224 HST total.

2. If you prefer strip piecing instead of cutting individual rectangles from Fabrics D and E, cut squares



needed first, and then cut the remaining fabric into strips 1¼" x WOF. Join one strip of each fabric to make a pieced band, and cut the 5½" and 3½" units from the band. Repeat to make 112 of each size unit. Referring to the Block Diagram, join the patches, units, and HST to make a block. Make 56 blocks.




Block – Make 56

3. Referring to the Quilt Diagram, arrange the blocks as you wish. Once you are satisfied with the arrangement, join 8 blocks and 9 sashes to make a block row. Make 7 block rows. Join 8 sashes and 9 cornerstones to make a sash row. Make 8 sash rows. Join the rows, alternating types.
4. Sew the shorter borders to the sides of the quilt. Sew the longer borders to the top and bottom.

Finishing the Quilt

5. Layer the quilt with batting and backing and baste. Quilt in the ditch around borders and block patches. Quilt the block centers as you wish. Bind to finish the quilt.




