The dynamic color shifts form a pleasing mandala design in this lovely wall quilt. The black background sets off the jewel-tone prints for a dramatic, contemporary look.

Cutting Directions

Note: Read assembly directions before cutting patches. All measurements are cut sizes and include ¼" seam allowances. A fat ¼ is an 18" x 20"-22" cut. WOF designates the width of fabric from selvedge to selvedge (approximately 42" wide).

Fabric A

Cut (14) squares 5" (4%") for HST (Read Step 1 before cutting)

Fabric B

Cut (6) squares 5" (4%") for HST

Fabric C

Cut (8) squares 5" (4%") for HST Cut (4) squares 41/2"

Fabric D

Cut (10) squares 5" (4\%") for HST

Fabric E

Cut (6) squares 5" (4\%") for HST

Fabric F

Cut (4) squares 16½" x 16½" Cut (64) squares 5" (4½") for HST Cut (56) squares 4½"

3 Prints From each:

Cut (8) squares 5" (4\%") for HST

Binding

Cut (7) strips 21/2" x WOF for binding


Backing

Cut (2) lengths 36" x 72", pieced to fit quilt top with overlap on all sides

Making the Quilt

1. Read all Step 1 before cutting or sewing the squares. The quilt is made with half-square triangles (HST) that finish 4" square. Cutting squares 5" allows for trimming the HST after stitching. If you wish to eliminate this trimming step, cut 4\%" squares for HST. Use your favorite method to make HST, or follow these directions. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of all bright 5" squares (all fabric except Fabric F). Place a marked square on a black 5" square, right sides together. Sew ¼" seam on each side of the marked line; cut apart on the marked line (Diagram 1). Press open to make pieced HST. Trim the squares to 4½" if needed. Make a total of 128 HST. Make 4 more HST for the quilt's center using 2 Fabric A and 2 Fabric B squares.




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- 2. Referring to the Quarter Quilt Diagram, arrange the HST, black 4½" squares, and a Fabric C 4½" square into rows as shown. Turn the HST to match the design. Join the patches into horizontal rows to make larger units. Join the top unit with a black 16½" square. Join the top unit to the bottom unit.
- **3.** Make 4 quarter quilts all alike. Finally, join the quarter quilts to make the quilt, rotating each unit 90 degrees to make the design shown in the quilt photograph.

Finishing the Quilt

4. Layer the quilt with batting and backing and baste. Quilt in the ditch around block patches. Quilt the background black patches as you wish. Bind to finish the quilt.
