This medallion-style quilt would look stunning on a wall or as a topper. The unique prints will appeal to anyone interested in engineering, science, space travel, or UFO phenomenon.

Cutting Directions

Note: Read assembly directions before cutting patches. All measurements are cut sizes and include $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowances. A fat $\frac{1}{8}$ is a 9" x 20"-22" cut of fabric. A fat $\frac{1}{4}$ is a 18" x 20"-22" cut of fabric. Mitered borders include extra length for insurance. WOF designates the width of fabric from selvedge to selvedge (approximately 42" wide).

Cut (4) squares 4½"

Cut (112) squares 21/2"

Cut (4) rectangles $6\frac{1}{2}$ " x $12\frac{1}{2}$ " Cut (4) squares $6\frac{1}{2}$ "

Cut (12) T2

Fabric F

Cut (12) T1

Fabric G

Cut (12) T2

Cut (112) squares 2½"

Fabric H

Cut (20) rectangles $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $4\frac{1}{2}$ "

Fabric I

Cut (8) strips $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF, pieced to make the following: (4) borders $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x 74"

From 1: Cut (4) squares $4\frac{1}{2}$ "

2 Blues

Cut (24) rectangles $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $6\frac{1}{2}$ "

2 Fat 1/4s

From each:

Cut (12) rectangles 21/2" x 61/2"

Backing

Cut (2) panels $40'' \times 80''$, pieced to fit quilt top with overlap on all sides



Making the Quilt


- 1. Conserve fabric by cutting Template 2 patches as shown in the cutting Diagram 1. Make acrylic templates of T1 and T2, including the dots. Poke holes through the template at each dot with an ice pick. Mark the dots on the back side of fabric patches. Pin a T2 patch on top of a T1, matching dots and ends. Pin every inch or so along the curve. Stitch in a 1/4" seam allowance. Press seam allowances toward T1. Trim each block to 61/2" square: position the 61/2" mark of the acrylic ruler on the corner of T1 as shown in Diagram 2. Trim T2 along the opposite edges. Be sure that a ¼" seam allowance remains beyond the T1/T2 seam. Referring to the quilt diagram for fabric combinations, make 24 blocks.
- 2. Referring to the Quilt Diagram, arrange the blocks and Fabric E patches in 6 rows. Join the rows.
- **3.** Join the $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $6\frac{1}{2}$ " strips to make 12 Unit 1 and 12 Unit 2 (Diagram 3). Arrange the units around the quilt in the order shown. Join 3 Unit 1 and 3 Unit 2 to make a border. Make 4 borders. Sew to the sides of the guilt. Sew Fabric K squares to ends of 2 borders. Sew to the top and bottom.
- **4.** Sew Fabric A borders to the sides. Join Fabric C squares to ends of remaining borders. Sew to the top and bottom.
- **5. Flying Geese:** Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of each Fabric G 21/2" square. Hint: After making a few Flying Geese, you may feel confident enough to eliminate the diagonal line and stitch the squares "by eye". Place a marked square on one end of a lime 2½" x 4½" rectangle, right sides together. Sew on the marked line; trim away and discard excess fabric (Diagram 4). Press open. Repeat this process on the opposite end of the rectangle (Diagram 5) to make a Flying Geese Unit. Make 112 total.
- 6. Referring to the Quilt Diagram, arrange 28 Flying Geese on each side of the quilt, noting change of direction in the center of each border. Once you are satisfied with the color arrangement, join the geese to make 4 borders. Sew to the sides of the quilt. Join a lime $4\frac{1}{2}$ " square to ends of remaining borders. Sew to the top and bottom.
- 7. Sew Fabric I borders to the quilt, starting and stopping stitching 1/4" from the quilt's raw edge. Miter the corners and trim the excess.

Finishing the Quilt


8. Layer the quilt with batting and backing and baste. Quilt in the ditch around borders and block patches. Quilt curved block patches and outer border as you wish. Quilt around the printed motif in Fabric A border. Bind to finish the quilt.




Cutting - Diagram 1



Block - Make 24












Quilt Diagram


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*Indicates fabrics used in quilt pattern. Fabrics shown are 25% of actual size.



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
