Quilt finishes: 60" x 80"
16 Pieced Blocks: 8" x $8 "$

Simple pinwheel motifs bordered with triangles spin their way around this bright-colored quilt with a border print and baby chicks exclaiming "Aren't You Just the Tweetest!"

## Cutting Directions

Note: WOF designates the width of fabric from selvedge to selvedge (approximately $42^{\prime \prime}$ wide).
Fabric A Fussy-cut 2 sets of (2) identical $61 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 641 / 2 "$ strips and two sets of (2) identical $61 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 441 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips along the length of fabric

Fabric B Cut (3) strips $81 / 2 " \times$ WOF; crosscut strips into (12) $81 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ squares

Cut (3) strips $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF; crosscut strips into (35) $2 \frac{1}{2}$ " squares

Fabric C Cut (1) strip $47 / 8^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF; crosscut strip into (6) $47 / 8$ " squares Cut (6) strips $11 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF; piece together to make (2) $1 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime} \times 62^{1} / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips for side borders and (2) $11 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 441 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips for top and bottom borders.
Cut (7) strips $21 / 2 " \times$ WOF for binding
Fabric D Cut (2) strips $47 / 8$ " x WOF; crosscut strip into (12) $47 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ squares

Fabric E Cut (4) strips $81 / 2 "$ x WOF; crosscut strips into (58) $2 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime}$ sashing strips

Fabric F Cut (3) strips $41122^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF; crosscut strips into (24) $41 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ squares

Fabric G Cut (4) strips $41122^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF; crosscut strips into (28) $41 / 2$ " squares

Fabric H Cut (4) strips $47 / 8^{\prime \prime} \mathrm{x}$ WOF; crosscut strips into (14) $47 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ squares

Fabric I Cut (2) strips $41 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF; crosscut strips into (12) $41 / 22^{\prime \prime}$ squares

Fabric J Cut (1) strip $47 / 8^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF; crosscut strips into (6) $47 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ squares

Fabric K Cut (4) strips $47 / 8^{\prime \prime} \mathrm{x}$ WOF; crosscut strips into (26) $47 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ squares

Backing Cut (2) panels $42^{\prime \prime} \times 88^{\prime \prime}$ and piece to fit quilt top with 4 " overlap on all sides

## Making the Blocks

Note: Refer to Diagrams 1-4 to make the blocks.

1. Draw a diagonal line from corner to corner on the wrong side of each $47 / 8$ " fabric $K$ and fabric J square and all $41 / 2$ " squares.
2. Place a marked $47 / 8$ " fabric K square right sides together with a $47 / 8$ " fabric $H$ square. Stitch $1 / 4$ " on each side of the marked line. Cut apart on the marked line and press open with seam toward the fabric H triangles to make two H/K units. Repeat to make a total of $28 \mathrm{H} / \mathrm{K}$ units. (Diagram 1)

3. Repeat step 2 to make a total of $24 \mathrm{D} / \mathrm{K}$ and $12 \mathrm{C} / \mathrm{J}$ units.
4. Select four $\mathrm{H} / \mathrm{K}$ units and join to make two rows of two units; press seams toward H triangles. Join the rows to make an $\mathrm{H} / \mathrm{K}$ block unit; press seam to one side. Repeat to make seven H/K block units. (Diagram 2)

5. Repeat step 4 with the $\mathrm{D} / \mathrm{K}$ and $\mathrm{C} / \mathrm{J}$ units to make six $\mathrm{D} / \mathrm{K}$ and three $\mathrm{C} / \mathrm{J}$ block units.
6. Place a $41 / 2$ " fabric G square right sides together on one corner of an $\mathrm{H} / \mathrm{K}$ block unit and stitch on the marked line; trim seam allowance to $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ and press $G$ to the right side. Repeat on each corner of the $\mathrm{H} / \mathrm{K}$ block unit to complete one Framed Pinwheel G block. Repeat to complete a total of seven G blocks. (Diagram 3)

7. Repeat step 6 with $F$ squares and $D / K$ block units to complete a total of six Framed Pinwheel F blocks and with I squares and C/J block units to complete a total of three Framed Pinwheel I blocks.

## Completing the Quilt Top

Note: Refer to the Quilt Diagram for all steps.
12. Select one each Framed Pinwheel $G$ and I blocks, two $8^{1} / 2^{\prime \prime}$ fabric B squares and five $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 81 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ fabric E strip; join to make a row. Press seams toward fabric E strips. Repeat to make a total of three identical rows.
13. Repeat step 12 with two Framed Pinwheel F blocks, two $8^{1 / 2 "}$ fabric B squares and five $2^{1} / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 88^{1 / 2}$ " fabric E strips to make a total of three identical rows.
14. Join four $2^{1} / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 8^{1} / 2^{\prime \prime}$ fabric E strips with five $21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ fabric $B$ squares to make a sashing row. Press seams toward the fabric E strips. Repeat to make a total of seven sashing rows.
15. Join the block rows with the sashing rows, positioning rows referring to the Quilt Diagram to complete the quilt center. Press seams toward sashing rows.
16. Sew a $11 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 62^{1} / 2^{\prime \prime}$ fabric $C$ strip to the long sides and the $11 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 44^{1} / 2^{\prime \prime}$ fabric C strips to the top and bottom of the quilt center. Press seams toward the fabric C strips.
17. Sew a $61 / 2$ " $\times 64^{1} / 2^{\prime \prime}$ fabric A strip to the long sides of the quilt center with the same section of the strip on the outside edges on each side. Press seams toward the fabric A strips.
18. Sew a Framed Pinwheel $G$ block to each end of each $61 / 2{ }^{\prime \prime}$ x $441 / 2 "$ fabric A strip. Press seams toward strips. Sew these strips to the top and bottom of the quilt center to complete the quilt top. Press seams toward the fabric A strips.

## Finishing the Quilt

19. Layer quilt top with batting and backing. Quilt in the ditch of seams and as desired. Bind to finish the quilt.
