





Cutting Directions

Note: Read assembly directions before cutting patches. Borders are cut to exact length required plus 1/4" seam allowance. WOF designates the width of fabric from selvedge to selvedge (approximately 42" wide).

Refer to Diagram 1 to cut from each of the (16) Fat 1/4's: (2) 5 $\frac{1}{4}$ " x 21" strips. Sub-cut the strips into (16) Template 1 triangles. After cutting all of the (16) Fat 1/4's you should have a total (256) Template 1 triangles. Note: Only (252) Template 1 triangles will be used. (1) 3 ½" x 21" strip. Sub-cut the strip into (8) Template 2 triangles. After cutting all of the (16) Fat 1/4's you should have a total (128) Template 2 triangles

Fat Quarter Cutting Diagram



Fabric B

Cut (16) 5 1/4" x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into (252) Template 1 triangles.

Cut (6) 3 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into (124) Template 2 triangles.

Fabric C

Cut (4) 4 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x $81\frac{1}{2}$ " strips. Cut (4) 4 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 4 ½" x 71 ½" strips.

Fabric D

Cut (8) 2 1/2" x WOF strips for the binding.

Backing

Cut (2) 97" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together and trim to make (1) 79" x 97" backing.

Making the Quilt

1. Block Assembly

Sew (1) Fabric A-Template 2 triangle to the short side of (1) Fabric B-Template 1 triangle to make (1) Unit 1 block (Diagram 2). Repeat to make (128) Unit 1 blocks total.

2. Sew (1) Fabric A-Template 1 triangle to (1) long side of (1) Unit 1 block to make (1) Unit 2 block (Diagram 3). Repeat to make (128) Unit 2 blocks total.



Color Way

3. Paying attention to the orientation of the units, sew (4) Unit 2 blocks together to make (1) Block One square (Diagram 4). The square should measure 9 ½" square. Repeat to make (32) Block One squares total.





- Sew (1) Fabric B-Template 2 triangle to the short side of (1) Fabric A-Template 1 triangle to make (1) Unit 3 block (Diagram 5). Repeat to make (124) Unit 3 blocks total.
- Sew (1) Fabric B-Template 1 triangle to (1) long side of (1) Unit 3 block to make (1) Unit 4 block (Diagram 6). Repeat to make (124) Unit 4 blocks total.





6. Paying attention to the orientation of the units, sew (4) Unit 4 blocks together to make (1) Block Two square (Diagram 7). The square should measure 9 ½" square. Repeat to make (31) Block Two squares total.







- Sew together (4) Block One squares and (3) Block Two squares, alternating them, to make (1) Row One strip (Diagram 8 below). Repeat to make (5) Row One strips total.
- 8. Sew together (4) Block Two squares and (3) Block One squares, alternating them, to make (1) Row Two strip (Diagram 9 below). Repeat to make (4) Block Two strips total.

Quilt Top Assembly

(Refer to the Quilt Layout when assembling the quilt top.)

- **9.** Sew the (5) Row One strips and (4) Row Two strips together lengthwise and alternating them to make the Center Block.
- **10.** Sew (1) $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x $81\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 4 ½" x 71 ½" Fabric C strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.









Finishing the Quilt

- 11. Layer and quilt as desired.
- **12.** Sew the (8) binding strips together, end to end with a 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.
- 13. Bind as desired.

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
