Introducing Makower UK new collection: Farm Animals by The Henley Studio
Quilt designed by Heidi Pridemore

Quilt finished 55" x 68"

Go for a hayride down on the farm with this whimsical quilt. It is a perfect project for advanced beginners and it is quick to assemble.

Cutting Directions

Note: Read assembly directions before cutting patches. Borders are cut to exact length required plus $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance. WOF designates the width of fabric from selvedge to selvedge (approximately 42" wide).

Fabric A Fussy cut (4) $3\frac{3}{4}$ " x $56\frac{1}{2}$ " strips from the length of fabric (LOF), each centered on a row of animals.

Fabric B Cut (2) $8\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into (5) $8\frac{1}{2}$ " squares.

Fabric C Cut (2) $8\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into (6) $8\frac{1}{2}$ " squares.

Fabric D Cut (2) $8\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into (6) $8\frac{1}{2}$ " squares.

Fabric E Cut (1) $8\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strip. Sub-cut the strip into (4) $8\frac{1}{2}$ " squares.

Fabric F Cut (2) $5\frac{1}{2}$ " x $58\frac{1}{2}$ " LOF strips.
Cut (2) $5\frac{1}{2}$ " x $55\frac{1}{2}$ " strips from the remaining fabric, piece as needed.

Fabric G Cut (12) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips. Sew the strips together, end to end with diagonal seams, and cut (8) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $56\frac{1}{2}$ " strips.
Cut (3) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips. Sew the strips together, end to end with diagonal seams, and cut (2) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $45\frac{1}{2}$ " strips.

Fabric H Cut (5) $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into (44) $4\frac{1}{2}$ " squares.
Cut (7) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips for the binding.

Backing Cut (2) 63" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together and trim to make (1) 63" x 76" backing.

Making the Quilt

1. Block Assembly:

Place (1) $4\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric H square on the top left corner of (1) $8\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B square, right sides together (Diagram 1). Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Diagram 1). Flip open the triangle formed and press (Diagram 2). Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from the sewn seam.





2. Follow Diagram 3 for the seam direction to add a $4\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric H square to each of the remaining corners of the $8\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B square to make B-block (Diagram 4).







Farmland

- Repeat Steps 1-2 to make (5) B-blocks total.
- Repeat Steps 1-2 using (6) $8\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric D squares and (24) $4\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric H squares to make (6) D-blocks (Diagram 5).




- Quilt Top:**
(Refer to the *Quilt Layout when assembling the quilt top.*)
Sew (1) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $56\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric G strip to each side of (1) $3\frac{3}{4}$ " x $56\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric A strip, lengthwise, to make (1) A-column. Repeat to make (4) A-columns total.
- Refer to the layout to for block placement and sew together seven assorted blocks to make one column. Repeat to make three block columns total.

- Sew together the A columns and block columns, alternating them to make the quilt top.
- Sew (1) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $45\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric G strip to the top and to the bottom of the quilt top.
- Sew (1) $5\frac{1}{2}$ " x $58\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric F strip to each side of the quilt top. Sew (1) $5\frac{1}{2}$ " x $55\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric F strip to the top and to the bottom of the quilt top.

Finishing the Quilt

- Layer and quilt as desired.
- Sew the (7) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF Fabric H strips together, end to end with a 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.
- Bind as desired.




Quilt Layout




1486-1 5 1/4 yds
