Quilt finishes 66" x 86" 12 Blocks: 18" x 18" Pillow finishes: 22" x 22"

Say hello to these canine buddies all decked out for the holidays. Bows, scarves, caps, and antlers are just some of the cute seasonal accessories that adorn these dogs. The large blocks are easy to piece so that you will be snuggling under this large throw in time for the next winter chill.

Cutting Directions Note: Read assembly

directions before cutting patches. All measurements are cut sizes and include $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowances. A fat $\frac{1}{8}$ is a 9" x 21" cut of fabric. A fat $\frac{1}{4}$ is an 18" x 20"-22" cut. Borders are cut the exact lengths required plus $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowances. WOF designates the width of fabric from selvedge to selvedge (approximately $\frac{4}{3}$ " wide).

Cutting for the Quilt

Fabric A Cut (2) squares 7" (or 6\%") for HST (Read Step 2 before cutting.)
Cut (3) squares 6\%" for block centers

Fabric B Cut (4) squares 7" (or 6\%") for HST Cut (2) squares 6\\\'\''\$ for block centers

Fabric C Cut (48) rectangles $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x $6\frac{1}{2}$ "

Fabric D Cut (2) squares 7" (or 67/8") for HST

Fabric E Cut (32) squares 3½" for FG

Fabric F Cut (24) squares 3½" for FG

Fabric G Cut (16) squares $3\frac{1}{2}$ " for FG

Fabric H Cut (24) squares $3\frac{1}{2}$ " for FG

Fabric I Cut (2) side borders $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x $78\frac{1}{2}$ ",

cut lengthwise

Cut (2) top/bottom borders $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x $66\frac{1}{2}$ ",

cut lengthwise

Cut (3) sashes $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $58\frac{1}{2}$ ", cut lengthwise

Cut (8) sashes $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $18\frac{1}{2}$ ", cut lengthwise

Cut (24) squares 7" (or 61/8") for HST

Cut (48) rectangles 3½" x 6½"

3 Dog Prts. From each:

Cut (2-3) squares 6½" (7 total)

2 Bone Prt. From each:

Cut (2) squares 7" (or 61/8") for HST

Cut (4) squares 7" (or 61/8") for HST

Cutting for ONE Pillow

Fabric 1 Cut (1) square $6\frac{1}{2}$ " for block center

Fabric 2 Cut (2) squares 7" (or 6\%") for HST (Read Step 2 before cutting.)

Fabric 3 Cut (4) rectangles $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x $6\frac{1}{2}$ "

Fabric 4 Cut (8) squares $3\frac{1}{2}$ " for FG

Background (Fabric I)

Cut (2) borders 2½" x 22½"

Cut (2) borders $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $18\frac{1}{2}$ "


Cut (4) rectangles $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x $6\frac{1}{2}$ " for FG Cut (2) squares 7" (or $6\frac{7}{8}$ ") for HST

Backing Cut (1) square 24"

Making the Quilt

- 1. Yardage is sufficient in some cases to substitute one print for another in the quilt or pillows. Feel free to change the fabric combinations in the blocks as you wish.
- 2. The blocks are made with half-square triangles (HST). Use your favorite method to make HST that finish 6", or follow these directions. Fabric squares cut 7" will be trimmed after stitching. Cut the squares 67%" if you do not wish to trim later. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of the Fabric I 7" squares. With right sides together, position the marked square on top of a colored 7" square. Stitch 1/4" on each side of the diagonal line (Diagram 1). Cut apart on the drawn line. Press the seam allowance toward the darker fabric. Trim to 61/2" as needed. Make 4 HST for each block.







5. Refer to the Quilt Diagram. On a large flat surface or design board, arrange the blocks into 4 rows of 3 blocks each. Position Fabric I 18½" sashes between the blocks. Join the blocks and sashes into 4 rows. Stitch 58½" sashes between rows.

6. Sew longer Fabric I borders to the sides. Sew shorter borders to the top and bottom.

7" (6%") HST +

Block – Make 12


Finishing the Quilt

7. Layer the quilt with batting and backing and baste. Quilt in the ditch around borders, sashes, and block patches. Quilt around the printed motifs in the center squares. Quilt the Fabric I background patches as you wish. Bind to finish the quilt.

Making ONE Pillow

- **1.** Follow the directions above to make 1 block. Stitch shorter borders to the sides and longer borders to the top and bottom.
- 2. If you wish to quilt the pillow top, layer it with batting and an inner lining. Quilt as desired. Position the pillow front on top of the backing, right sides together. Pin all around. The backing should be an inch larger than the pillow top all around. Stitch in a ¼" seam, leaving a generous opening along one side, not at the corner. Backstitch at the opening to secure. Trim the backing even with the pillow front, and trim the corners. Turn right side out and use a knitting needle or chopstick from the inside to push the seam out so there are no puckers. Press the edges. Lightly stuff with polyfil or a pillow form. Stitch the opening closed.
