Quilt finishes 44" x 52"
8 Sailboat Blocks: 6" x 6"

The fun, sun-filled days of summer are the focus in this colorful wall quilt. Easy-to-piece sailboat blocks are the only patchwork needed, and novelty prints with beach town, cabanas, and boats in the harbor add the visual excitement. Make this as a stand-alone quilt, or make the other three seasonal quilts as companion pieces.

Cutting Directions

Note: Borders are cut the exact lengths required plus 1/4" seam allowances. WOF designates the width of fabric from selvedge to selvedge (approximately 42" wide).

Fabric A Fussy-cut 1/4" away from the edge of the large printed center square on each side
Fussy-cut 1/4" away from the stripe border around each of the (4) small squares.

Fabric B Cut (2) borders 9 3/4" x 26"

Fabric C Cut (2) borders 2 1/2" x 40 1/2"
Cut (2) borders 2 1/2" x 32 1/2"
Cut (5) 2 1/2" x WOF strips for binding

***Fabric D** Cut (2) borders 1 1/2" x 24 1/2"
Cut (2) borders 1 1/2" x 22 1/2"

Fabric E Cut (2) borders 2 1/2" x 36 1/2"
Cut (2) borders 2 1/2" x 28 1/2"

Fabric F Cut (16) squares 2 7/8" x 2 7/8"

Fabric G Cut (16) squares 2 7/8" x 2 7/8"
Cut (16) rectangles 1 1/2" x 4 1/2"
Cut (8) rectangles 1" x 6 1/2"

Fabric H Cut (8) rectangles 2" x 6 1/2"

Fabric I Cut (16) squares 2" x 2"
Cut (3) 2" x wof strips, recut into (2) 2" x 20 1/2" pieces and (2) 2" x 22 1/2" pieces
Cut (4) 1 1/4" x wof strips, from each strip cut into (2) 1 1/4" x 8 1/2" and (2) 1 1/4" x 10" pieces

*Additional fabric required for backing.

Backing Cut (2) panels 30" x 52", pieced to fit quilt



Making Sailboat Blocks

- The boat sails are made with quick-pieced half-square triangles (HST). Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of each Fabric G 2 7/8" square. Place a marked square on a Fabric F square, right sides together. Sew a scant 1/4" seam on each side of the marked line; cut apart on marked line (Diagram 1). Press open to make 2 pieced squares. Make 32 total.
- To make the boat bottom, draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of each Fabric I 2" square. Referring to Diagram 2, place a marked square on a Fabric H 2" x 6 1/2" rectangle, right sides together, aligning raw edges at one end. Stitch on the drawn line; trim away and discard excess fabric. Press open. Repeat on the opposite end, watching orientation of the sewing line. Make a total of 8 boat bottoms.
- Referring to the Sailboat 1 Piecing, join 4 HST to make a unit. Sew a Fabric G 1 1/2" x 4 1/2" rectangle to each side of the unit. Sew the boat bottom in place. Sew the 1" x 6 1/2" strip to the top. Make 4 Sailboat 1's. Change the orientation of the HST to make the 4 Sailboat 2 blocks.



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
Assembling the Quilt

4. Refer to the Quilt Diagram. Sew the Fabric I $2'' \times 20\frac{1}{2}''$ borders to the top/bottom and the Fabric I $2'' \times 22\frac{1}{2}''$ and to the sides of the Fabric A printed panel. Center the panel and trim the bordered center square to $22\frac{1}{2}'' \times 22\frac{1}{2}''$. Sew the fabric D $1\frac{1}{2}'' \times 22\frac{1}{2}''$ borders to the sides and the Fabric D $1\frac{1}{2}'' \times 24\frac{1}{2}''$ borders to the top/bottom of the quilt center.
5. Add Fabric E borders to the top and bottom of the quilt center; sew borders to the sides. Sew Fabric C borders to the quilt in the same order.

6. Sew a Fabric I $1\frac{1}{4}'' \times 8\frac{1}{2}''$ border to opposite sides of each of the small fussy cut Fabric A panels. Sew a Fabric I $1\frac{1}{4}'' \times 10''$ to top/bottom of the same squares. Center printed panel and trim each bordered square to $9\frac{3}{4}''$ square. Sew these squares to each end of a Fabric B border. Sew borders to top/bottom of the quilt.

Finishing the Quilt

7. Layer the quilt with batting and backing and baste the layers together. Bind to finish the quilt.




Quilt Diagram

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
