I have always loved ombre fabrics. Trendier than ever, the timing seemed right for an ombre with a bit of an edge! Inferno takes the classic idea of an ombre fabric and turns it on its head with a sophisticated and painterly design.

#### **Cutting Directions**

**Note:** Read assembly directions before cutting patches. All measurements are cut sizes and include 1/4" seam allowances. WOF designates the width of fabric from selvedge to selvedge (approximately 42" wide).

**Fabric A** Cut (2) borders 3½" x 110"

Cut (25) sashes 2" x 103½" Cut (144) rectangles 2" x 3½"

Cut strips listed on Quilt Diagram

**Fabric B** Cut (10) strips  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF for binding

Cut (1) strip  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $43\frac{1}{2}$ ", cut crosswise (WOF)

Cut (6) squares 3½"

23 Prints From each:

Cut (1) strip  $3\frac{1}{2}$  x  $43\frac{1}{2}$  , cut crosswise

(Read Step 1.)

Cut (6) squares 3½"

**Backing** Cut (2) panels  $40'' \times 117''$ , pieced to fit quilt


#### **Making the Quilt**

- long, don't worry. As long as all 24 strips are the same length, the quilt design works. Note that each ombre print is darkest at the selvedges and lightest in the center. In order to reverse the dark/light placement, cut each ombre print strip in half at the center (the lightest point), and piece the two halves together at the darkest points. Join (3) 3½" print squares alternately with 3 black 2" x 3½" rectangles. Press seam allowances toward the rectangles. Sew this unit to the top of a 43½" strip of the same fabric, with the black rectangle touching the long strip. Repeat on the bottom of the strip. Repeat this step with each of the 24 long strips.
- 2. Referring to the Quilt Diagram, cut the 3½"-wide black strips listed on the top and bottom of the first pieced unit from Step 1. Sew the strips to the top and bottom of the pieced unit. Hint: Pin a safety pin at the top of this unit so that you won't inadvertently turn it upside down in Step 3. Continue from left to right, cutting and stitching the strips to the top and bottom of each pieced unit one by one.
- 3. Sew a 2"-wide black sash between each of the pieced units, being careful to keep the pieced units in the right orientation. Press all seam allowances toward the black sashes. Trim the top and bottom of the quilt if needed.
- **4.** Sew the black borders to the top and bottom of the quilt.

#### **Finishing the Quilt**

**5.** Layer the quilt with batting and backing and baste. Quilt in the ditch around borders and block patches. Quilt the long print strips as you desire. Bind to finish the quilt.
