

Cutting Directions


Note: Read assembly directions before cutting patches. All measurements are cut sizes and include $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowances. A fat $\frac{1}{8}$ is a 9" x 20"-22" cut of fabric. A fat $\frac{1}{4}$ is an 18" x 20"-22" cut. Borders are cut the exact lengths required plus $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowances. WOF designates the width of fabric from selvedge to selvedge (approximately 42" wide).




Making the Quilt


 Referring to the block diagrams, sew the appropriate strips to each center patch. Press all seam allowances away from the centers. Make the number of blocks as shown.


- 2. Referring to the Quilt Diagram, arrange the blocks in 4 vertical rows in the order shown. Join the blocks into rows, and then join the rows.
- 3. Sew long Fabric D borders to the sides of the quilt. Sew short Fabric D borders to the top and bottom.

 Repeat these steps with Fabric J borders.

Join Fabric C border strips carefully so that the print is uninterrupted. Sew longer borders to the sides, noting the orientation of the print. Sew longer borders to the top and bottom.

Finishing the Quilt

4. Layer the quilt with batting and backing and baste. Quilt in the ditch around borders and block patches. Quilt around the printed motifs in the outer border. Bind to finish the quilt.
