## Quilt Cutting Directions

Note: Read assembly directions before cutting patches. Borders are cut to exact length required plus $1 / 4$ " seam allowance. WOF designates the width of fabric from selvedge to selvedge (approximately 42 " wide).

## Small Version

Fabric A
Cut (72) $27 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ squares from the $5 "$ charm pack squares. Cut the squares across (1) diagonal to make (144) $27 / 8$ " triangles.

Fabric B Cut (5) $87 / 8^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into (18) $8^{7 / 8 "}$ squares.
Cut the squares across (1) diagonal to make (36) $8^{7 / 8}$ " triangles.
Cut (6) $21 / 2 " \times$ WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into (36) $21 / 2$ " $\times 6^{1 / 2 "}$ strips.
Cut (4) $21 / 2$ " x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into (36) $21 / 2 " \times 41 / 2 "$ strips.
Cut (3) $21 / 2$ " x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into (36) $21 / 2$ " squares.

Binding $\quad \operatorname{Cut}(5) 21 / 2 " \times$ WOF strips.
Backing Cut (2) 56 " x WOF strips. Sew the strips together and trim to make (1) $56 " \times 56 "$ backing.

## Large Version

Fabric A Cut (72) $47 / 8$ " squares from the 5 " charm pack squares. Cut the squares across (1) diagonal to make (144) $41 / 8$ " triangles.

Fabric B Cut (9) $167 / 8$ " x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into (18) 16 7/8" squares.
Cut the squares across (1) diagonal to make (36) $167 / 8$ " triangles.

Cut (12) $41 / 2 " x$ WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into (36) $41 / 2 " \times 121 / 2$ " strips.
Cut (9) $41 / 2$ " $\times$ WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into (36) $4^{1 / 2 "} \times 81 / 2 "$ strips.
Cut (4) $41 / 2$ x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into (36) $41 / 2$ " squares.

## Binding $\quad \operatorname{Cut}(10) 21 / 2 " \times$ WOF strips for the binding.

Backing
Cut (3) 104 " x WOF strips. Sew the strips together and trim to make (1) 104" x 104" backing.

## Making the Quilt - Small Version

Note: Pay attention to the unit orientations when assembling the various components.

## Block Assembly

1. Sew (1) $27 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric A triangle to the right end of (1) $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 61 / 2 "$ Fabric B strip to make (1) Unit 1 strip (Diagram 1). Repeat to make (36) Unit 1 strips total.

2. Sew (1) $27 / 8$ " Fabric A triangle to the right end of (1) $21 / 2$ " $\times 41 / 2$ " Fabric B strip to make (1) Unit 2 strip (Diagram 2). Repeat to make (36) Unit 2 strips total.
3. Sew (1) $27 / 8 "$ Fabric A triangle to the right side of (1) $21 / 2$ " Fabric B square to make (1) Unit 3 strip (Diagram 3). Repeat to make (36) Unit 3 strips total.

4. Sew together (1) Unit 1 strip, (1) Unit 2 strip, (1) Unit 3 strip and (1) $27 / 8$ " Fabric A triangle, in that order from top to bottom, aligning the left sides of the fabrics to make (1) Unit 4 triangle (Diagram 4). Repeat to make (36) Unit 4 triangles total.

5. Sew (1) $87 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric B triangle to the long side of (1) Unit 4 triangle to make (1) Unit 5 square (Diagram 5). The unit should measure 8 1/2" square. Repeat to make (36) Unit 5 squares total.

6. Sew together (4) Unit 5 squares into a $2 \times 2$ matrix to make (1) $161 / 2$ " Block One square (Diagram 6). Repeat to make (9) Block One squares total.

Quilt Top Assembly
(Refer to the Quilt Layout when assembling the quilt top. Pay attention top the unit orientations when assembling the quilt top.)
7. Sew together (3) Block One squares to make Row One. Repeat to make Row Two and Row Three.
8. Sew together the (3) Rows, lengthwise and in numerical order from top to bottom, to make the $48^{1 / 2 "} \times 48^{1 / 2}$ " quilt top.

## Finishing the Quilt - Small Version

9. Layer and quilt as desired.
10. Sew the (5) Fabric $C$ binding strips together, end to end with a 45 -degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.
11. Bind as desired.

## Making the Quilt - Large Version

Note: Pay attention to the unit orientations when assembling the various components.

## Block Assembly

1. Sew (1) $47 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric A triangle to the right end of (1) $41 / 2 " \times 121 / 2 "$ Fabric B strip to make (1) Unit 1 strip. Repeat to make (36) Unit 1 strips total.

2. Sew (1) $4^{7 / 8 "}$ Fabric A triangle to the right end of (1) $4^{1 / 2 "} \times 81 / 2$ " Fabric B strip to make (1) Unit 2 strip. Repeat to make (36) Unit 2 strips total.

3. Sew (1) $4^{7 / 8}$ " Fabric A triangle to the right side of (1) $41 / 2$ " Fabric B square to make (1) Unit 3 strip. Repeat to make (36) Unit 3 strips total.
4. Sew together (1) Unit 1 strip, (1) Unit 2 strip, (1) Unit 3 strip and (1) $47 / 8$ " Fabric A triangle, in that order from top to bottom, aligning the left sides of the fabrics to make (1) Unit 4 triangle. Repeat to make (36) Unit 4 triangles total.

5. Sew (1) $167 / 8$ " Fabric B triangle to the long side of (1) Unit 4 triangle to make (1) Unit 5 square. The unit should measure $161 / 2 "$ square. Repeat to make (36) Unit 5 squares total.

6. Sew together (4) Unit 5 squares into a $2 \times 2$ matrix to make (1) $321 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Block One square. Repeat to make (9) Block One squares total.

## Quilt Top Assembly

(Refer to the Quilt Layout when assembling the quilt top. Pay attention top the unit orientations when assembling the quilt top.)
7. Sew together (3) Block One squares to make Row One. Repeat to make Row Two and Row Three.
8. Sew together the (3) Rows, lengthwise and in numerical order from top to bottom, to make the $96^{1} / 2$ " x $961 / 2$ " quilt top.

## Finishing the Quilt - Large Version

9. Layer and quilt as desired.
10. Sew the (10) Fabric $C$ binding strips together, end to end with a 45 -degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.
11. Bind as desired.
