

Introducing Andover Fabrics new collection: **Mini Heart** by Andover Fabrics Quilt designed by Janet Houts

Quilt finishes **65**½" **x 75**½"" 144 Blocks: 7" x 7"

Let these heart prints declare your love of sewing. What a fun project for anyone with a little sewing experience. It is the perfect size to snuggle under with someone your heart beats for.

Cutting Directions

Note: Read assembly directions before cutting patches. All measurements are cut sizes and include ¼" seam allowances. A fat ¼ is an 18"-20" cut of fabric. Borders include ¼" seam allowances plus 2" extra length for insurance. WOF designates the width of fabric from selvedge to selvedge (approximately 42" wide).

Fabric A

Cut (2) side borders 31/2" x 72", cut lengthwise

Cut (2) top/bottom borders 3½" x 68", cut lengthwise

Cut (6) squares 11½", cut in half diagonally twice to make 24 quarter-square triangles

Cut (2) squares 6", cut in half diagonally to make 4 half-square triangles

Cut (288) rectangles 11/2" x 31/2"

Fabric B

Cut (72) squares 11/2"

7 Prints 6 Blocks from each:

Cut (24) squares 31/2"

6 Prints 5 Blocks from each:

Cut (20) squares 31/2"

Binding

Cut (8) strips 21/2" x WOF for binding


Backing

Cut (2) lengths 38" x 86", pieced to fit quilt top with overlap on all sides

Making the Quilt

1. Referring to the Block diagram, arrange 4 print squares with 1 Fabric B square and 2 Fabric A rectangles as shown. Join the patches into 3 rows. Press the seam allowances away from Fabric A patches. Join the rows to make a block. Make the number of blocks in each fabric as listed in the cutting directions, a total of 72 blocks.




2. Referring to the Quilt Assembly, arrange the blocks into diagonal rows, paying careful attention to the fabric placement. Look through a camera or the wrong end of binoculars to check for errors. Once you are satisfied, join the blocks into diagonal rows. Sew a Fabric A quarter-square triangle at the ends of each row as shown. These triangles are cut slightly larger for insurance. They will be trimmed later. Join the rows to make the quilt. Sew Fabric A half-square triangles at the corners.

- **3.** Trim the Fabric A triangles at the outer edges of the quilt as needed, leaving a generous ¼" seam allowance all around.
- **4.** Sew long Fabric A borders to the sides. Trim the borders even with the top and bottom edges of the quilt. Sew remaining borders to the top and bottom. Trim as needed.

Finishing the Quilt

5. Layer the quilt with batting and backing and baste. Quilt in the ditch around borders and patches. Quilt the Fabric A triangles as you wish. Bind to finish the quilt.



Quilt Assembly

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All fabrics fabrics are used in quilt pattern. Fabrics shown are 100% of actual size.

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
