This graphic, up-to-the-moment contemporary quilt uses value in an unexpected way. In the color-wheel progression, there are light sections that merge into dark sections to keep the eye intrigued. The piecing is perfect for a beginning quilter, with strips and easy half-square triangles all that are needed.

## Cutting Directions

Note: Read assembly directions before cutting patches. All measurements are cut sizes and include $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ seam allowances. WOF designates the width of fabric from selvedge (approximately $42^{\prime \prime}$ wide).

## Fabrics A, B

Cut (1 or 2) strips $2^{1 / 2 \prime \prime}$ x WOF (Read Step 3)
Cut (2) strips $11 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 301 / 2^{\prime \prime}$, pieced to make the following: (1) sash $1 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime} \times 601 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ (Read Step 2)
Cut the number of $3^{\prime \prime}$ (or $27 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ ) squares listed here for HST (Read Step 1 before cutting)

## Fabric A, B

From each: Cut (7) squares $3^{\prime \prime}$ (or $27 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ )
Fabrics C, M, N, O, R, V
From each: Cut (8) squares $3^{\prime \prime}$ (or $27 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ )
Fabrics D, E, F, G, H, I, J, L, P, S, U
From each: Cut (9) squares $3^{\prime \prime}$ (or 27/8")
Fabrics K, Q, T
From each: Cut (10) squares $3^{\prime \prime}$ (or $27 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ )

## Binding

Cut (7) strips $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF for binding

## Backing

Cut (2) lengths $38^{\prime \prime} \times 70^{\prime \prime}$, pieced to fit quilt top

## Stagger Quilt

## Making the Quilt

1. We suggest that you begin at the top of the quilt and complete each row as you come to it before cutting more fabric. Every pieced row has half-square-triangles (HST) made with 2 fabrics. Every fabric is used in 2 rows. Refer to the Quilt Assembly.

Use your favorite method to make HST that finish $2^{\prime \prime}$, or follow these directions. Fabric squares cut $3^{\prime \prime}$ will be trimmed after stitching. Cut the squares $2^{7 / 8 \prime \prime}$ if you do not wish to trim later. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of the lighter $3^{\prime \prime}$ fabric squares. With right sides together, position a marked square on top of the second fabric square. Stitch $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ on each side of the diagonal line (Diagram 1). Cut apart on the drawn line. Press the seam allowance toward the darker fabric. Trim each square to $2^{1 / 2 \prime}$ " if needed.

2. For each fabric, join the two $1 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime} \times 301 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips to make the long sashes between the pieced rows. Set aside.
3. Refer to the Quilt Assembly for the measurements of the two $2^{11 / 2 \prime} 2^{\prime \prime}$-wide strips required for each row. You can cut some rows from one $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF strip, and others will require 2 strips. Cut the lengths as needed for construction.
4. Refer to the Quilt Assembly. For Row 1, join 9 HST made with D and Q fabrics with the $301 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ and $12^{1 / 2 \prime}$ Fabric D strips. Press seam allowances open or in one direction. Sew the $601 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric Q sash to the bottom of pieced Row 1.
5. For Row 2, join 9 HST made with $Q$ and $P$ fabrics with the $321 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ and $101 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric Q strips. Sew to the bottom of the unit. Sew the $60 ½{ }^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric P sash to the bottom.
6. Repeat these steps to add each pieced row, followed by the appropriate sash. Press seam allowances toward the narrow sashes.

## Finishing the Quilt

7. Layer the quilt with batting and backing and baste. Quilt in the ditch around patches and sashes. Quilt the long $2^{\prime \prime}$-wide strips as you wish. Or, quilt an overall design. Bind to finish the quilt.
