Quilt finishes 38'' x 50'' 8 Block Y: 5'' x 4'' 8 Block Z: 5'' x 4''

Here is a project for you whether you prefer whimsical, sophisticated, or rainbow-vibrant. One quilt looks like a sunrise, another an underwater world, and one a desert. The central panel of each of the five quilts determines the color palette for the pieced border blocks.

Cutting Directions


Note: Read assembly directions before cutting patches. All measurements are cut sizes and include ¼" seam allowances. A fat ¼ is an 18" x 20"-22" cut. Borders are cut the exact lengths required plus ¼" seam allowances. WOF designates the width of fabric from selvedge to selvedge (approximately 42" wide). **Note:** Cut patches from each fabric in the order listed.

Fabric A Fussy-cut (1) panel 28¹/₂" x 38¹/₂", cut crosswise

- Fabric BCut (6) rectangles 2½" x 5½" for top/bottom border
Cut (8) Template 3 (read Steps 1-3 first)
Cut (8) Template 3 reversed
- Fabric CCut (12) rectangles $2^{1/2''} x 5^{1/2''}$ Cut (8) Template 3Cut (8) Template 3 reversed
- **Fabric D** Cut (8) rectangles $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $5\frac{1}{2}$ "
- Fabric ECut (8) rectangles $2^{1}\!/2^{\prime\prime} \ge 5^{1}\!/2^{\prime\prime}$ Cut (8) Template 1Cut (8) Template 1 reversed
- Fabric FCut (4) rectangles $2\frac{1}{2}" \ge 5\frac{1}{2}"$ Cut (8) Template 1Cut (8) Template 1 reversed
- Fabric GCut (8) Template 2Cut (8) Template 2 reversed
- Fabric HCut (8) Template 2Cut (8) Template 2 reversed
- Fabric ICut (5) strips $2^{1}\!/2'' \ge 0$ x WOF for binding
Cut (2) side borders $1^{1}\!/2'' \ge 38^{1}\!/2''$
Cut (2) top/bottom borders $1^{1}\!/2'' \ge 30^{1}\!/2''$
- **Backing** Cut (2) panels 28" x 44", pieced to fit quilt top with overlap on all sides

Making the Quilt

- Each pieced border block has 2 units that are pieced and then joined together. Make cardboard or acrylic templates of patterns #1, #2, and #3. Label and cut out the 3 templates. Poke a hole through each template at the dots.
- 2. Refer to the Block Y and Block Z diagrams for fabric placement. For each patch, align the grain line of the template with the grain of fabric. Draw around template 1 on the wrong side of Fabric E. Mark dots through the holes in the template. Rotate the template so its long side is next to the edge of the first patch. (Diagram 1). Draw around the template and mark the dots. Repeat to mark 8 patch 1 on Fabric E. Flip the template over so it is reversed. Mark 8 reversed patches on the wrong side of Fabric E. Mark through the dots on the wrong side of the patches. Likewise, mark 8 patch 1 and 8 patch 1 reversed on Fabric F. Cut out the fabric patches.




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3. Repeat Step 2 to cut other patches as follows: Paying attention to the grain line, position and mark template 2 on the wrong side of Fabric G. As before, mark the dots. Nestle the template next to the first patch and mark a second patch 2 (Diagram 2). Mark a total of 8 patch 2 from Fabric G and 8 from Fabric H. Turn the template over and mark 8 patch 2 reversed from Fabric G and 8 from Fabric H. Repeat these steps to mark 8 patch 3 and 8 patch 3 reversed from Fabrics B and C. Cut out the patches.

4. Referring to the block diagrams, join the 3 patches for each block unit in the order shown, matching dots and sewing with "scant" ¹/₄" seam allowances. Press seam allowances in F/G/C units toward patch 1. Press seam allowances


in E/H/B units toward patch 3. Each unit should measure 3" x 4½". Sew the appropriate units together in pairs to make 8 Block Y and 8 Block Z. The blocks should measure 5½" x 4½".

- 5. Referring to the Quilt Diagram, sew longer borders to the Fabric A panel. Sew shorter borders to the top and bottom.
- 6. Join 4 Block Y and 4 Block Z alternately in the order shown to make a side border. Sew to the side of the quilt. Repeat for the opposite side.
- Join the 2¹/₂" x 5¹/₂" rectangles in the order shown to make the top and bottom pieced borders. Sew to the quilt.

Finishing the Quilt

8. Layer the quilt with batting and backing and baste. Quilt in the ditch around borders and block patches. Bind to finish the quilt.
