## Quilt finishes 81' x 102"

As modern as today's latest tweet, this colorful quilt will be ready to place on your queen-size bed in no time at all. The 20 exotic prints are framed with neutral sashes that allow each fabric to stand out. Arrange the rectangles as shown on the quilt or as your design sensibilities dictate.

Fabric Requirements

| Fabric A | sash, binding | $31 / 2$ yards | $8367-\mathrm{L}$ |

## Cutting Directions

Note: Read assembly directions before cutting patches. All measurements are cut sizes and include $1 / 4$ " seam allowances. WOF designates the width of fabric from selvedge to selvedge (approximately $42^{\prime \prime}$ wide).

Fabric A Cut (4) sashes $31 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 81^{1 / 2} 2^{\prime \prime}$, cut lengthwise Cut (21) sashes $312^{\prime \prime} \times 30^{1 / 2} 2^{\prime \prime}$, cut lengthwise Cut (10) strips $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF for binding

## 20 Prints Cut 1 patch from each fabric:

Cut (16) rectangles $10^{1 / 2 \prime \prime} \times 30^{1 / 2 \prime \prime}$ (read Step 1 first)
Cut (1) rectangle $10^{1 / 2^{\prime \prime}} \times 2012^{\prime \prime}$
Cut (2) rectangles $10^{1 / 2} 2^{\prime \prime} \times 15^{1 / 2^{\prime \prime}}$
Cut (1) square $101 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 10^{1 / 2 \prime} 2^{\prime \prime}$
Backing Cut (3) panels $38^{\prime \prime} \times 89^{\prime \prime}$, pieced to fit quilt top with overlap on all sides

## Making the Quilt

1. Note that each of the 20 fabrics is used once in the quilt. Referring to the quilt photo and diagram, choose which fabrics you wish to cut into the smaller rectangles and the square.
2. Referring to the Quilt Diagram, sew the $10^{1 / 2 \prime \prime} \times 20^{1 / 2^{\prime \prime}}$ rectangle to the $101 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ square. Sew the $10^{1 / 2 \prime \prime} \times 15^{1 / 2 \prime \prime}$ rectangles together. The pieced rectangles should measure $301 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ long.
3. Position the rectangles as you like into 3 rows of 6 rectangles each. Once you are satisfied with the arrangement, join 6 rectangles alternately with 7 Fabric A $30^{1 / 2 \prime \prime}$ sashes to make a row. Press the seam allowances toward the sashes. Make 3 rows. Join the rows with the Fabric A $811 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ sashes. Press seam allowances toward the sashes.

## Finishing the Quilt

4. Layer the quilt with batting and backing and baste. Quilt in the ditch around sashes. Quilt each rectangle as you wish. We suggest that you follow the lines of the prints or use an overall quilting motif. Quilt the sashes as you wish. Bind to finish.
