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# American Glory Quilt 

## Introducing Andover Fabrics new collection: REVEILLE by Kathy Hall

 Quilt designed by Janet HoutsQuilt finishes 72' x 86'
30 Blocks: 12' x 12'

Stars and stripes forever! This twin-size quilt is sure to bring out feelings of pride in our "sweet land of liberty." The piecing is quick and easy.

## Cutting Directions

Note: All measurements are cut sizes and include $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ seam allowances. A fat $1 / 4$ is an $18^{\prime \prime} \times 20^{\prime \prime}-22^{\prime \prime}$ cut. WOF designates the width of fabric from selvedge to selvedge (approximately $42^{\prime \prime}$ wide).

## Cutting for 1 block.

Read Step 1 before cutting patches.
From a Light Print:
Cut (12) squares $21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$
From Print \#2:
Cut (4) squares $41 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ for corner patches
Cut (4) rectangles $2^{1 / 2^{\prime \prime}} \times 41^{\prime \prime} 2^{\prime \prime}$ for Flying Geese
From Print \#3:
Cut (4) rectangles $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 4 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime}$ for frame around center square

From Print \#4:
Cut (1) square $41 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ for center patch

## Fabric A

Cut (26) strips $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF, pieced to make the following:
(7) sashes $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 71^{\prime \prime} 2^{\prime \prime}$
(36) sashes $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 12^{1 / 2 \prime}$

## Fabric B

Cut (8) strips $2^{1} / 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF for binding
Cut (12) rectangles $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 41^{\prime \prime} 2^{\prime \prime}$

## Remaining Fabrics:

Cut patches as needed for each block (read Step 1)

## Backing

Cut (2) panels 40 " x 94 ", pieced to fit quilt top with overlap on all sides

Fabric B binding $3 / 4$ yard $8984-\mathrm{LB}$
4 Lights blocks $5 / 8$ yard each 8979-L 8981-N 8983-N 8984-L
6 Fat $1 / 4$ s blocks Fat $1 / 4$ yard each *8978-L 8978-N 8980-LB 8980-N
8983-LB 8983-Y
4 Darks blocks $1 / 2$ yard each 8979-LB 8979-NR 8981-NB 8982-LB
2 Reds blocks $3 / 4$ yard each 8981-LR 8982-NR
2 Med. blocks 1 yard each 8978-LB 8982-Y
Backing $\quad 51 / 4$ yards *8978-L

## Making the Quilt

1. Yardage is given to make the 30 blocks as shown in the block diagrams. Each block requires 4 fabrics-one light print and 3 prints from the remaining fabrics. Refer to the blocks to choose fabrics needed, and cut patches for one block at a time, referring to cutting directions above. Hint: Yardage is sufficient to allow you to make slight alterations to fabric placement if you wish. Pay attention to the cutting of directional prints. When cutting the $2^{1 / 2^{\prime \prime}} \times 44^{1 / 2 \prime \prime}$ rectangles for Flying Geese from a stripe, 2 of the rectangles must be cut lengthwise and 2 cut crosswise for the print to be oriented correctly in the block. Also, decide if you want the stripes in the 4 rectangle frames around the center square to be cut lengthwise or crosswise. Whatever you decide, cut these 4 rectangles alike.
2. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of all 360 light $2^{1 / 2} 2^{\prime \prime}$ squares. With practice, you may be able to eliminate this drawn line and stitch the little squares on "by eye." The corner units in each block are made with a quick stitch-and-flip piecing method. Hint: If the corner squares and Flying Geese are made with a directional print, before sewing, lay out the patches on a flat surface and rotate them as needed to be sure that the print is oriented as you wish. The $2^{1 / 2 \prime \prime}$ marked squares will need to be stitched to a different corner on each of the $41 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ squares. Refer to a block with a striped print in the corners if this is not clear to you.

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3. Referring to Diagram 1 , place a marked light square on a $41 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ corner square, right sides together, aligning raw edges at the corner. Stitch on the


Diagram 1 drawn line; trim away and discard excess fabric. Press open. Make 4 corner units for each block, referring to directions in Step 2 for orientation of directional print squares.
4. The blocks each have 4 Flying Geese units. Place a marked light square on one end of a $2^{1 / 2 \prime} \times 41 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangle, right sides together. Sew on the marked

Flying Geese line; trim away and discard excess fabric (Diagram2). Press open. Repeat this process on the opposite end of the rectangle to make a Flying Geese Unit. Make 4 total for each block.
5. Referring to the block diagram, arrange and join the pieced units and


Block - Make 30 patches in 3 rows. Join the rows to make a block. Make 3 each of the 10 different blocks, or arrange the fabrics as you desire. Make 30 blocks total.
6. Referring to the Quilt Diagram, on a large flat surface, lay out the blocks in 6 rows. Pay attention to the orientation of the directional prints in each block. Once you are satisfied with the arrangement, join 5 blocks with 6 short sashes to make a horizontal row. Make 6 rows. Join the rows with the long sashes in between rows.

## Finishing the Quilt

7. Layer the quilt with batting and backing and baste. Quilt in the ditch around sashes and block patches. Bind to finish the quilt.
