

Introducing Andover Fabrics new collection: **SALUTE** by Kathy Hall Quilt designed by Janet Houts

Quilt finishes 80" x 108" 6 Block Y: 16" x 16"

5 Block Y: 16" x 16"

8 Block Z: 8" x 16"

Rally round the flag with this patriotic crowd pleaser. The big blocks make quick and easy work of this queen-size quilt. You will be flying your colors in no time at all.

Cutting Directions

Note: Read assembly directions before cutting patches. All measurements are cut sizes and include ¼" seam allowances. Borders are cut the exact lengths required plus ¼" seam allowances. WOF designates the width of fabric from selvedge to selvedge (approximately 42" wide).

Fabric A

Fussy-cut (11) squares 8½"

Fabric B

- Cut (6) strips $10\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF, pieced to make the following:
 - (2) strips $10\frac{1}{2}$ " x $88\frac{1}{2}$ "
- Cut (2) rectangles $10\frac{1}{2}$ " x $16\frac{1}{2}$ ", cut lengthwise

Fabric C

- Cut (4) strips 8½" x WOF, pieced to make the following:
 - (2) top/bottom strips $8\frac{1}{2}$ " x $80\frac{1}{2}$ "

Fabric D

Cut (10) strips 2½" x WOF for binding

Cut (8) strips 21/2" x WOF to make the following:

- (5) Log Cabin rectangles $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $12\frac{1}{2}$ "
- (11) rectangles $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $10\frac{1}{2}$ "
- (6) rectangles $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $8\frac{1}{2}$ "

Cut (32) squares 2½" for Flying Geese

Fabric E

Cut (9) strips 2½" x WOF to make the following:

- (6) rectangles $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $12\frac{1}{2}$ "
- (11) rectangles $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $10\frac{1}{2}$ "
- (5) rectangles $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $8\frac{1}{2}$ "

Cut (32) squares 21/2" for Flying Geese

Fabric F

Cut (16) rectangles $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x $8\frac{1}{2}$ "

Fabric G

- Cut (11) strips 2½" x WOF to make the following:
 - (6) rectangles $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $16\frac{1}{2}$ "
 - (11) rectangles $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $14\frac{1}{2}$ "
 - (5) rectangles $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $12\frac{1}{2}$ "

Fabric H

- Cut (11) strips 21/2" x WOF to make the following:
 - (5) rectangles $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $16\frac{1}{2}$ "
 - (11) rectangles $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $14\frac{1}{2}$ "
 - (6) rectangles $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $12\frac{1}{2}$ "

Fabric I

- Cut (32) rectangles $21\!\!/\!2"$ x $41\!\!/\!2"$ for Flying Geese
- Cut (32) squares 2½"

Fabric J

- Cut (18) strips 2½" x WOF, pieced to make the following:
 - (6) strips $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $88\frac{1}{2}$ "
 - (2) strips $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $80\frac{1}{2}$ "
 - (2) strips $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $16\frac{1}{2}$ "
- Cut (8) squares $4\frac{1}{2}$ "


Backing


Cut (3) panels 39" x 44", pieced with horizontal seams to fit quilt top with overlap on all sides

Making the Quilt

- 1. Referring to the Block X and Block Y diagrams, sew appropriate patches to the Fabric A squares to make the number of blocks indicated. Press all seam allowances away from the center.
- 2. Block Z uses Flying Geese units. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of each Fabric D and Fabric E 21/2" square. Place a marked D square on the left end of a Fabric I 2½" x 4½" rectangle, right sides together. Sew on the marked line; trim away and discard excess fabric (Diagram 1). Press open. Repeat this process on the opposite end of the rectangle with a Fabric E square (Diagram 2) to make a Flying Geese unit. Make 32 total.





Flying Geese (FG) Make 32


- 3. Referring to the Block Z diagram, sew a Flying Geese unit to opposite sides of a Fabric J 4½" square. Sew Fabric I 2½" squares to ends of 2 Flying Geese units. Sew these to the top and bottom of the block. Sew F rectangles to 2 sides of the block. Repeat to make a total of 8 Block Z.
- **4.** Refer to the Quilt Diagram for the following steps. Arrange the X, Y, and Z blocks, Fabric J 2½" x 16½" strips, and Fabric B 16½" x 10½" rectangles in 3 vertical rows. Pay attention to the placement and rotation of the blocks. When you are satisfied with the arrangement of the parts, join them into 3 vertical rows. Join the rows alternately with 2 Fabric J 88½" strips.
- 5. Sew a Fabric B strip between 2 long J strips. Sew to the side of quilt. Repeat for the other side. Join Fabric J and Fabric C 801/2"-long strips together and sew to the top of the quilt. Repeat for the bottom.

Finishing the Quilt

6. Layer the guilt with batting and backing and baste. Quilt in the ditch around borders and block patches. Quilt around the printed motifs as you wish. Bind to finish the quilt.
