How to make up Scandi 2462 R and S Placemat and Runner Panels

2462/R



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	Quantity	Backing with Binding	Backing - Pillowcase Method
2462/R	one panel (60cms / 24")	1m	70 cms
2462/S	one panel (60cms / 24")	1m	70 cms
60 x 120cm batting and co-ordinating thread			
Optional Iron-on (Hot fix) crystals (4mm and/or 6mm)			

Method A Traditional (with binding)

- Cut backing to match width of panel (60cm x 114cm). From remainder cut 11 binding strips, each 1½" wide.
- Lay backing down wrong side up on a flat surface.
- Place batting over and smooth any wrinkles.
- Lay panel on top face up.
- Use your favourite basting method pinning, tacking (you will need to tack the individual pieces) or spray basting.
- Cut between the pieces to separate them.
 - NOTE. You may prefer to quilt the individual pieces while still in one large piece and trim back to \(^4\)" seam allowance afterwards.
- Quilt each piece using your favourite method either by hand or machine.
- Trim the three layers leaving a ¼" seam allowance around each piece.
- Bind using your favourite method.

Method B Pillowcase (no binding)

- Lay the batting down on a flat surface and smooth out wrinkles.
- Lay backing face up on top of batting.
- Place panel face down on the backing fabric. Panel and backing are face to face.
- Pin to secure layers ready to sew along the edge of the designs on each piece.
 NOTE. You may wish to cut the pieces apart and work with smaller pieces rather than the whole panel layered up in one piece.
- Carefully sew along the outer edge of each piece leaving an opening on one side of each piece. Back stitch start and end of each bit of stitching.
- Very carefully trim away the batting in the seam allowance area of each piece.
- Trim the panel and backing fabric to leave a ¼" seam allowance all around each piece.
- Trim the corners carefully, then turn right side out.
- Gently ease corners out with a fat knitting needle.
- Slipstitch the openings closed.
- Gently press, then pin or tack the layers together.
- Quilt using your favourite method by hand or machine.

Optional crystals

Add as much bling as you like or opt for a more subtle sprinkling to add glamour and Christmas sparkle
