First published in 1969, Eric Carle's The Very Hungry Caterpillar has been delighting children for decades. This charming nap-size quilt will delight any child who loves this time-honored book. The oversized panels and blocks with easy-peasy piecing make this a quilter's dream.

## Cutting Directions

Note: Read assembly directions before cutting patches. All measurements are cut sizes and include $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ seam allowances. A fat $1 / 8$ is a $9^{\prime \prime} \times 21^{\prime \prime}-22^{\prime \prime}$ cut of fabric. WOF designates the width of fabric from selvedge to selvedge (approximately $42^{\prime \prime}$ wide).

Fabric A Fussy-cut (2) rectangles $22^{1 / 2 \prime} 2^{\prime \prime} \times 20^{1 / 2 \prime}$, centering words
Fabric B Cut (1) square $81 / 2^{\prime \prime}$
Fabric C Cut (1) square 81/2"
Fabric D Cut (4) strips $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 221^{1 / 2^{\prime \prime}}$
Cut (4) strips $31 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 161 / 2^{\prime \prime}$
Cut (8) rectangles $41^{\prime \prime} \times 81 / 2^{\prime \prime}$
Cut (8) squares $3^{\prime \prime}$ for HST (read step 1)
Cut (8) squares $2^{1 / 2 \prime} 2^{\prime \prime}$
Fabric E Cut (2) borders $51 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 421 / 2^{\prime \prime}$, cut crosswise Cut (2) squares $81 / 2^{\prime \prime}$
Fabric F Cut (24) squares $4 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime}$
Cut (8) squares $21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$
Fabric G Cut (24) squares $4 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime}$
Cut (8) squares $2^{1 / 2 \prime} 2^{\prime \prime}$
Fabric H Cut (12) squares $41 / 2^{\prime \prime}$
Cut (4) squares $3^{\prime \prime}$ for HST
Cut (8) squares $2^{11 / 2 \prime}$
Fabric I Cut (7) strips $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF for binding
Cut (4) squares $41 / 2^{\prime \prime}$
Cut (4) squares $3^{\prime \prime}$ for HST
Cut (8) squares $21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$
Fabric J Cut (8) squares $41 / 2^{\prime \prime}$
Cut (4) squares $21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$

Fabric K Cut (4) borders $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 561 / 2^{\prime \prime}$
Cut (15) squares $2^{1 / 22^{\prime \prime}}$
3 Brights From each:
Cut (4) squares $8^{1 / 2 \prime} 2^{\prime \prime}$
Backing Cut (2) panels 37 " $\times 64$ ", pieced to fit quilt top with overlap on all sides

## Making the Quilt

1. The star blocks use half-square triangles (HST) that finish 2 " square. Use your favorite method to make HST, or follow these directions. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of each Fabric D 3" square (Diagram 1). Place a marked square on a Fabric I or H 3 " square, right sides together. Sew $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ seam on each side of the marked line; cut apart on the marked line. Press open. Trim each square to $21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$. Make 8 HST in each color combination. Set aside.


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2. To make the flying geese units needed for the star blocks, draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of 8 Fabric $F$ and 8 Fabric G $41 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ squares. Place a marked square on one end of a Fabric D $412^{\prime \prime} \times 81^{1 / 2}$ " rectangle, right sides together. Sew on the marked line; trim away and discard excess fabric (Diagram 2). Press open. Repeat this process on the opposite end of the rectangle to make a flying geese unit (Diagram 3). Make 4 of each color combination.
3. Referring to the star block diagram and the quilt photograph, arrange Fabric $D$ and $\mathrm{K} 21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ squares with the appropriate HST from step 1 to make a pieced corner. Make 4 pieced corners for each block. Join the pieced corners, the appropriate flying geese units, and a B or C $81 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ square into 3 rows. Join the rows. Sew Fabric D strips to the sides of the block, and then to the top and bottom. Repeat to make a second star block.
4. Referring to the quilt diagram, join the Fabrics F-K $21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ squares to make pieced sashes. Sew a sash with 10 squares between a Fabric A square and a star block to make the top row. Repeat to make the bottom row. Join 23 squares to make the center sash. Sew the long sash between the rows. Sew Fabric E borders to the sides.
5. The border blocks are made with quick stitch-and-flip piecing methods. Follow the quilt photograph for color combinations, or feel free to mix up the fabrics. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of 4 Fabric F $41 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ squares. Referring to Diagram 4, place a marked square on an $81 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ square (from 3 Brights), right sides together, aligning raw edges at the corner. Stitch on the drawn line; trim away and discard excess fabric. Press open. Repeat on the opposite corner, watching orientation of the sewing. Repeat on the remaining corners. Make 14 border blocks using Fabrics F-J $41 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ squares and the remaining $81 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ squares.
6. Referring to the Quilt Diagram, arrange 77 border blocks to make the top pieced border. Sew Fabric K borders to the row of blocks. Sew to the top of the quilt. Repeat for the bottom.

## Finishing the Quilt

7. Layer the quilt with batting and backing and baste. Quilt in the ditch around borders, sashes, and block patches. Quilt around the printed motifs in the Fabric A panels. Bind to finish the quilt.
