#### Quilt finishes 56" x 66" 2 Star Blocks: 22" x 20" 14 Border Blocks: 8" x 8"

First published in 1969, Eric Carle's The Very Hungry Caterpillar has been delighting children for decades. This charming nap-size quilt will delight any child who loves this time-honored book. The oversized panels and blocks with easy-peasy piecing make this a quilter's dream.

### **Cutting Directions**

**Note:** Read assembly directions before cutting patches. All measurements are cut sizes and include <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" seam allowances. A fat <sup>1</sup>/<sub>8</sub> is a 9" x 21"-22" cut of fabric. WOF designates the width of fabric from selvedge to selvedge (approximately 42" wide).

- **Fabric A** Fussy-cut (2) rectangles  $22^{1}/2'' \ge 20^{1}/2''$ , centering words
- Fabric B Cut (1) square 8<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>"
- Fabric C Cut (1) square 8<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>"
- Fabric D
   Cut (4) strips 2½" x 22½"

   Cut (4) strips 3½" x 16½"

   Cut (8) rectangles 4½" x 8½"

   Cut (8) squares 3" for HST (read step 1)

   Cut (8) squares 2½"
- Fabric ECut (2) borders  $5\frac{1}{2}$  x  $42\frac{1}{2}$ , cut crosswiseCut (2) squares  $8\frac{1}{2}$
- Fabric F
   Cut (24) squares 4½"

   Cut (8) squares 2½"
- Fabric G
   Cut (24) squares 4½"

   Cut (8) squares 2½"
- Fabric HCut (12) squares 4½"Cut (4) squares 3" for HSTCut (8) squares 2½"
- **Fabric I** Cut (7) strips 2<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" x WOF for binding Cut (4) squares 4<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" Cut (4) squares 3" for HST Cut (8) squares 2<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>"
- Fabric JCut (8) squares 4½"Cut (4) squares 2½"



**Fabric K** Cut (4) borders 2½" x 56½" Cut (15) squares 2½"

- **3 Brights** From each: Cut (4) squares 8<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>"
- **Backing** Cut (2) panels 37" x 64", pieced to fit quilt top with overlap on all sides

#### **Making the Quilt**

 The star blocks use half-square triangles (HST) that finish 2" square. Use your favorite method to make HST, or follow these directions. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of each Fabric D 3" square (Diagram 1). Place a marked square on a Fabric I or H 3" square, right sides together. Sew ¼" seam on each side of the marked line; cut apart on the marked line. Press open. Trim each square to 2½". Make 8 HST in each color combination. Set aside.







- 2. To make the flying geese units needed for the star blocks, draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of 8 Fabric F and 8 Fabric G 4<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" squares. Place a marked square on one end of a Fabric D 4<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" x 8<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" rectangle, right sides together. Sew on the marked line; trim away and discard excess fabric (Diagram 2). Press open. Repeat this process on the opposite end of the rectangle to make a flying geese unit (Diagram 3). Make 4 of each color combination.
- 3. Referring to the star block diagram and the quilt photograph, arrange Fabric D and K 2½" squares with the appropriate HST from step 1 to make a pieced corner. Make 4 pieced corners for each block. Join the pieced corners, the appropriate flying geese units, and a B or C 8½" square into 3 rows. Join the rows. Sew Fabric D strips to the sides of the block, and then to the top and bottom. Repeat to make a second star block.
- 4. Referring to the quilt diagram, join the Fabrics F-K 2½" squares to make pieced sashes. Sew a sash with 10 squares between a Fabric A square and a star block to make the top row. Repeat to make the bottom row. Join 23 squares to make the center sash. Sew the long sash between the rows. Sew Fabric E borders to the sides.
- 5. The border blocks are made with quick stitch-and-flip piecing methods. Follow the quilt photograph for color combinations, or feel free to mix up the fabrics. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of 4 Fabric F 4<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" squares. Referring to Diagram 4, place a marked square on an 8<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" square (from 3 Brights), right sides together, aligning raw edges at the corner. Stitch on the drawn line; trim away and discard excess fabric. Press open. Repeat on the opposite corner, watching orientation of the sewing. Repeat on the remaining corners. Make 14 border blocks using Fabrics F-J 4<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" squares and the remaining 8<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" squares.
- **6.** Referring to the Quilt Diagram, arrange 7 border blocks to make the top pieced border. Sew Fabric K borders to the row of blocks. Sew to the top of the quilt. Repeat for the bottom.


#### **Finishing the Quilt**

7. Layer the quilt with batting and backing and baste. Quilt in the ditch around borders, sashes, and block patches. Quilt around the printed motifs in the Fabric A panels. Bind to finish the quilt.









Quilt Diagram




