# Prism Quilt 

## Introducing Andover Fabrics new collection: THICKET by Alison Glass Quilt designed by Giucy Giuce

Quilt finishes 55" x 73'

Bring sunshine and flower power into your life with this delightful throw/twin-bed size quilt. The design allows for complete freedom to make each block unique. Follow the Quilt Diagram for color placement, or come up with your own version.

## Cutting Directions

Note: Read assembly directions before cutting patches. Patch measurements are cut sizes and include $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ seam allowances. Sash measurements include extra length for insurance. Side triangle patches are cut extra large for insurance and will be trimmed. A fat $1 / 4$ is an $18^{\prime \prime} \times 21^{\prime \prime}$ cut. WOF designates the width of fabric from selvedge to selvedge (approximately $42^{\prime \prime}$ wide).

## Cutting for ONE block:

Fabric A: Cut (4) rectangles $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 41 / 2^{\prime \prime}$
Cut (4) squares $21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$
Print \#1: Cut (4) rectangles $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 41^{1 / 2}$ for Flying Geese
Print \#2: Cut (4) rectangles $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 41 / 2^{\prime \prime}$
Print \#3: Cut (1) center square $41 / 2^{\prime \prime}$
Print \#4: Cut (12) squares $21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ for Flying Geese and corners

## Cutting for quilt:

Fabric A Cut (2) squares $21^{\prime \prime}$, cut in half diagonally to make 4 half-square triangles for corners (extra large for trimming)
Cut (2) squares $20^{\prime \prime} \times 20^{\prime \prime}$, cut in half diagonally twice to make 8 quarter-square triangles (you will use only 6)
Cut (2) sashes $11 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 68^{\prime \prime}$ (all sashes cut extra long for trimming)
Cut (2) sashes $1 / 1^{\prime \prime} \times 55^{\prime \prime}$
Cut (2) sashes $1^{1 / 2^{\prime \prime}}$ x $29^{\prime \prime}$
Cut (22) sashes $1^{1} 2^{\prime \prime} \times 12^{1 / 2 \prime} 2^{\prime \prime}$
Cut (68) rectangles $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 41 / 2^{\prime \prime}$
Cut (68) squares $2^{1 / 2 \prime} 2^{\prime \prime}$

## 20 Prints From each:

Cut patches for blocks as desired, referring to Quilt Diagram for color placement
Binding Cut (7) strips $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF for binding
Backing Cut (2) panels 41" $\times 63^{\prime \prime}$, pieced to fit quilt top with overlap on all sides

## Making the Quilt

1. Referring to the Quilt Diagram, choose 4 fabrics for a block. Feel free to arrange the prints as you wish. Cut the patches required for one block, including Fabric A patches.
2. Referring to Diagram 1, make 4 Flying Geese for one block as follows. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of 8 Print \#4 ( $21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ ) squares. Place a marked square on one end of a Print \#1 ( $2^{1 / 2 \prime} \times 44^{1 / 2 \prime}$ ) rectangle, right sides together (Diagram 1). Sew on the marked line; trim away and discard excess fabric. Press open. Repeat this process on the opposite end of the rectangle to make a Flying Geese. Make 4 alike.
3. Referring to the block diagram, join the Flying Geese and other patches in 5 horizontal rows. Join the rows to make a block.
4. Repeat these steps to make a total of 17 blocks, cutting patches to duplicate the quilt, or choosing and arranging prints according to your design sensibilities.
5. Referring to the Quilt Diagram, position the blocks, $122^{1 / 2 \prime}$ sashes, Fabric A triangles, and long sashes on a design wall or flat surface. Once you are satisfied with the overall look, join blocks and short sashes in diagonal rows.
6. Add Fabric A quarter-square triangles at the ends of rows where needed, and in the orientation shown. Note: Align the 90-degree corner of the Fabric A triangle with the corner of a block/short sash. Trim any points of the triangles where they stick out to prepare the block rows for the next step.
7. Sew the long sashes between rows, noting that they are cut extra long for insurance and will be trimmed later. When joining the block rows, be careful that the blocks align with one another from row to row. Once the rows and sashes are joined, trim long sashes where needed. Center and sew Fabric

## Finishing the Quilt

8. Layer the quilt with batting and backing and baste. Quilt in the ditch around sashes and block patches. Quilt outer triangles with a grid of squares on point, or as you wish. Bind to finish the quilt.
