# Haystack Quilt 

Introducing Andover Fabrics new collection: TRINKETS 2021 by Kathy Hall Quilt designed by Kathy Hall

Quilt finishes 72' x 72'"
9 Blocks: 24" x 24"

Quilts with a scrappy look, made from bits and pieces of clothing and other projects, have long been a tradition with quiltmakers. Much of the fun comes in deciding which fabrics to combine. Simple piecing makes this a good project for someone with some sewing experience. Ideas are given for possible projects using leftover patches.

## Cutting Directions

Note: Read assembly directions before cutting patches. All measurements are cut sizes and include $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ seam allowances. A fat $1 / 4$ is an $18^{\prime \prime} \times 20^{\prime \prime}-22^{\prime \prime}$ cut. WOF designates the width of fabric from selvedge to selvedge (approximately $42^{\prime \prime}$ wide).

## 24 Brights From each:

Cut (2) squares $67 / s^{\prime \prime}$, cut in half diagonally to make 4 half-square triangles (only 3 of each fabric will be used in quilt)
Cut (7-8) squares 4 " (or $37 / s^{\prime \prime}$ ) for HST, 180 total (Read Step 1 first)
Cut (1-2) squares $37 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ for blocks, 36 total, cut in half diagonally to make half-square triangles

## 6 Lights From each:

Cut (30) squares 4 " (or $37 / s^{\prime \prime}$ ) for HST (Read Step 1 first) Cut (6) squares $37 / s^{\prime \prime}$ for blocks, cut in half diagonally to make half-square triangles

## Binding

Cut (8) strips $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF for binding

## Backing

Cut (2) panels $40^{\prime \prime} \times 80^{\prime \prime}$, pieced to fit quilt top with overlap on all sides

## Making the Quilt

1. The blocks use HST that finish 3 " square. Use your favorite method to make HST, or follow these directions. Cut squares 4 " for HST that will be trimmed after stitching. If you prefer not to trim, cut squares $378^{\prime \prime}$. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of each light $4^{\prime \prime}\left(3^{7} / 8^{\prime \prime}\right)$ square (Diagram 1). Place a marked square on a bright square, right sides together. Sew $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ seam on each side of the marked line; cut apart on the marked line. Press open to make pieced HST. Trim to $31 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ square if needed. Make 360 total HST, using various combinations of light and bright prints.

2. Referring to the quarter block diagram, arrange 10 different HST, 2 light half-square triangles, and 2 bright $37 / \mathrm{s}^{\prime \prime}$ half-square triangles in 4 horizontal rows. Rotate the HST to form the design. Join the HST and triangles into rows, and then join the rows.
3. Sew bright $6^{7 / s^{\prime \prime}}$ half-square triangles to opposite corners as shown. The quarter block should measure $121 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ from raw edge to raw edge.
4. Choose 4 quarter blocks with different large corner triangles. Position them to make a $24^{\prime \prime}$ block, rotating each 90 degrees so the large triangles meet in the center. Join the units to make a block. Make 9 blocks.
5. Referring to the Quilt Diagram, arrange the blocks in 3 rows of 3 blocks each. Once you are satisfied with the

## Finishing the Quilt

6. Layer the quilt with batting and backing and baste. Quilt in the ditch around block patches. Or, quilt an overall design. Bind to finish the quilt.

Bonus Project: You will have 24 large bright triangles leftover for another project. Join 2 different triangles to make a square, for a total of 12 squares that finish $6^{\prime \prime}$. Set them into 4 rows of 3 squares each to make a pillow that finishes $24^{\prime \prime} \times 18^{\prime \prime}$. If squares are set into 6 rows of 2 squares each, you will have a table runner that finishes $36^{\prime \prime} \times 12^{\prime \prime}$. Experiment with the rotation of the squares to obtain different designs.
