## Cutting Directions

**Note: Read assembly directions before cutting patches.** Borders are cut to exact length required plus  $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance. WOF designates the width of fabric from selvedge to selvedge (approximately 42" wide).

**Fabric A** Cut (2)  $6\frac{7}{8}$ " x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into (12)  $6\frac{7}{8}$ " squares.  
Cut (6)  $2\frac{3}{8}$ " x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into (96)  $2\frac{3}{8}$ " squares.

**Fabric B** Cut (2)  $6\frac{7}{8}$ " x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into (12)  $6\frac{7}{8}$ " squares.

**Fabric C** Cut (3)  $2\frac{3}{8}$ " x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into (48)  $2\frac{3}{8}$ " squares.

**Fabric D** Cut (3)  $2\frac{3}{8}$ " x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into (48)  $2\frac{3}{8}$ " squares.

**Fabric E** Cut (6)  $2\frac{3}{8}$ " x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into (96)  $2\frac{3}{8}$ " squares.

**Fabric F** Cut (6)  $2\frac{3}{8}$ " x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into (96)  $2\frac{3}{8}$ " squares.

**Fabric G** Cut (6)  $2\frac{3}{8}$ " x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into (96)  $2\frac{3}{8}$ " squares.

**Fabric H** Cut (6)  $2\frac{3}{8}$ " x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into (96)  $2\frac{3}{8}$ " squares.

**Fabric I** Cut (6)  $2\frac{3}{8}$ " x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into (96)  $2\frac{3}{8}$ " squares.

**Fabric J** Cut (6)  $2\frac{3}{8}$ " x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into (96)  $2\frac{3}{8}$ " squares.  
Cut (4) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x  $72\frac{1}{2}$ " strips.  
Cut (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x  $57\frac{1}{2}$ " strips.

Cut (4)  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2)  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $80\frac{1}{2}$ " strips.

Cut (4)  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2)  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $66\frac{1}{2}$ " strips.

**Fabric K** Cut (6)  $2\frac{3}{8}$ " x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into (96)  $2\frac{3}{8}$ " squares.

**Fabric L** Cut (3)  $2\frac{3}{8}$ " x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into (48)  $2\frac{3}{8}$ " squares.

**Fabric M** Cut (3)  $2\frac{3}{8}$ " x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into (48)  $2\frac{3}{8}$ " squares.

**Fabric N** Cut (2)  $6\frac{7}{8}$ " x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into (12)  $6\frac{7}{8}$ " squares.

**Fabric O** Cut (2)  $6\frac{7}{8}$ " x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into (12)  $6\frac{7}{8}$ " squares.

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## Cutting Directions - Continued

**Fabric P** Cut (4) 3" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 3" x 75½" strips.  
Cut (4) 3" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 3" x 62½" strips.

**Fabric Q** Cut (8) 2½" x WOF strips for the binding.

**Backing** Cut (2) 92" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together and trim to make (1) 74" x 92" backing.

## Making the Quilt

### 1. Block Assembly

Place (1) 6⅞" Fabric A square on top of (1) 6⅞" Fabric B square, right sides together. Draw a line across the diagonal of the top square (Diagram 1). Sew ¼" away from each side of the drawn diagonal line (Diagram 1). Cut the two squares apart on the drawn diagonal line (Diagram 2) to make (2) BA units (Diagram 3). Trim the BA units to measure 6½" square. Repeat to make (24) BA units total.







2. Repeat Step 1 using (12) 6⅞" Fabric O squares and (12) 6⅞" Fabric N squares to make (24) 6½" ON units (Diagram 4).



3. Repeat Step 1 using (48) 2⅜" Fabric D squares and (48) 2⅜" Fabric C squares to make (96) 2" DC units (Diagram 5).

4. Repeat Step 1 using (96) 2⅜" Fabric F squares and (96) 2⅜" Fabric E squares to make (192) 2" FE units (Diagram 6).



5. Repeat Step 1 using (96) 2⅜" Fabric G squares and (96) 2⅜" Fabric A squares to make (192) 2" GA units (Diagram 7).



6. Repeat Step 1 using (96) 2⅜" Fabric I squares and (96) 2⅜" Fabric H squares to make (192) 2" IH units (Diagram 8).



7. Repeat Step 1 using (96) 2⅜" Fabric K squares and (96) 2⅜" Fabric J squares to make (192) 2" KJ units (Diagram 9).



8. Repeat Step 1 using (48) 2⅜" Fabric M squares and (48) 2⅜" Fabric L squares to make (96) 2" ML units (Diagram 10).



9. Sew (1) KJ unit, (1) IH unit, (1) GA unit and (1) FE unit together in that order to make (1) strip. Repeat to make a second strip. Sew (1) strip to each side of (1) BA unit. Pay attention to the orientation of the units and of the strips..

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**10.** Sew the following units in order: (1) DC, (1) FE, (1) GA, (1) IH, (1) KJ and (1) ML. Repeat to make a second strip. Sew the strips to the top and to the bottom of the BA unit to make (1) Block One (Diagram 11). Pay attention to the orientation of the units and of the strips.

**11.** Repeat Steps 9-10 to make (24) Block Ones total.



**12.** Sew (1) KJ unit, (1) IH unit, (1) GA unit and (1) FE unit together in that order to make (1) strip. Repeat to make a second strip. Sew (1) strip to each side of (1) ON unit. Pay attention to the orientation of the units and of the strips..

**13.** Sew the following units in order: (1) DC, (1) FE, (1) GA, (1) IH, (1) KJ and (1) ML. Repeat to make a second strip. Sew the strips to the top and to the bottom of the ON unit to make (1) Block Two (Diagram 12). Pay attention to the orientation of the units and of the strips.

**14.** Repeat Steps 12-13 to make (24) Block Twos total.



## Quilt Top Assembly

*(Refer to the Quilt Layout when assembling the quilt top.)*

**15.** Sew (1) Block One, (1) Block Two, (2) Block Ones, (1) Block Two and (1) Block One together in that order to make Row One. Pay attention to the orientation of the blocks. Repeat to make Rows Three, Six and Eight.

**16.** Sew (1) Block Two, (1) Block One, (2) Block Twos, (1) Block One and (1) Block Two together in that order to make Row Two. Pay attention to the orientation of the blocks. Repeat to make Rows Four, Five, and Seven.

**17.** Sew the (8) rows together in numerical order to make the quilt top.


**18.** Sew (1) 2" x 72 1/2" Fabric J strip to each side of the quilt top. Sew (1) 2" x 57 1/2" Fabric J strip to the top and to the bottom of the quilt top.

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- 19.** Sew (1) 3" x 75 1/2" Fabric P strip to each side of the quilt top. Sew (1) 3" x 62 1/2" Fabric P strip to the top and to the bottom of the quilt top.
- 20.** Sew (1) 2 1/2" x 80 1/2" Fabric J strip to each side of the quilt top. Sew (1) 2 1/2" x 66 1/2" Fabric J strip to the top and to the bottom of the quilt top.

## Finishing the Quilt

- 21.** Layer and quilt as desired.
- 22.** Sew the (8) 2 1/2" x WOF Fabric Q strips together, end to end with a 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.
- 23.** Bind as desired.
