## Cutting Directions

Note: Read assembly directions before cutting patches. Borders are cut to exact length required plus $1 / 4$ " seam allowance. WOF designates the width of fabric from selvedge to selvedge (approximately 42 " wide).

Cut (1) $11 / 2$ " $\times$ WOF strip. Sub-cut the strip into (8) $11 / 2$ " squares.

Fabric J Cut (2) $181 / 4$ " $\times$ WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into (3) $181 / 4$ " squares and (2) $93 / 8$ " squares. Cut the $181 / 4$ " squares across both diagonals to make (12) 18 1/4" triangles. Note: You will only use (10) 18 1/4" triangles. Cut the $93 / 8$ " squares across (1) diagonal to make (4) $93 / 8$ " triangles.
Cut (4) 3 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into (48) $31 / 2$ " squares.
Cut (2) $31 / 2 " \times$ WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into (12) $3^{1 / 2 "} \times 6^{1 / 2 "}$ strips.

## Cutting Directions-Continued

Cut (4) $31 / 2$ " x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into (12) $31 / 2$ " $\times 121 / 2 "$ strips.
Cut (7) $21 / 2$ " x WOF strips for the inner border.
Cut (8) $21 / 2$ " x WOF strips for the outer border.
Cut (5) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into (96) 2 " squares.
Cut (6) $11 / 2$ " x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into (24) $11 / 2 " \times 101 / 2 "$ strips.
Cut (8) $11 / 2$ " x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into (24) $11 / 2 " \times 121 / 2 "$ strips.

Fabric K Cut (1) $61 / 2 " \times$ WOF strip. Sub-cut the strip

Fabric L Cut (2) $31 / 2$ " $\times$ WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into (24) 3 1/2" squares.

Fabric M $\quad \operatorname{Cut}(7) 11 / 2 " \times$ WOF strips for the middle border.

Backing Cut (2) 86 " x WOF strips. Sew the strips together and trim to make (1) 69 " $\times 86$ " backing.

## Pillow (both versions)

Fabric A Cut (1) $61 / 2$ " square.
Fabric B Cut (1) 5 " x WOF strip. Sub-cut the strip into (4) 5 " $\times 61 / 2 "$ strips and (4) 2" squares.

Fabric C See instructions to cut (4) Leaves.
Fabric D Cut (1) $141 / 2$ " $x$ WOF strip. Sub-cut the strip into (2) $141 / 2$ " x $201 / 2 "$ strips.
Cut (1) 5" x WOF strip. Sub-cut the strip into (4) 5" squares.
Cut (1) 3" x WOF strip. Sub-cut the strip into (2) 3 " $\times 15^{1 / 2 "}$ strips.
Cut (1) 3" x WOF strip. Sub-cut the strip into (2) 3 " $\times 201 / 2 "$ strips.
Cut (1) $23 / 4$ " x WOF strip. Sub-cut the strip into (8) $23 / 4$ " squares.

(2) 20 " pillow forms

## Making the Quilt

Note: The arrows in the figures denote fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations while assembling the various components.

## 1. Block Assembly

Place (1) $11 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric B square on the top left corner of (1) $41 / 2 "$ Fabric A square, right sides together (Diagram 1). Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Diagram 1). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle $1 / 4$ " away from the sewn seam (Diagram 2).

2. Follow Diagram 3 for the seam direction to add a $11 / 2$ " Fabric B square to each of the remaining corners of the $41 / 2$ " Fabric A square to make (1) Unit 1 square (Diagram 4).
3. Repeat

Steps 1-2 to make a second Unit 1 square.

4. Repeat Steps 1-2 and refer to Diagrams 5-9 for fabric identification, placement, seam direction and orientation to make (2) of each unit square for Unit 2 through Unit 6.

5. Place (1) 2" Fabric J square on the top left corner of (1) $3^{1 / 2 "} \times 4^{1 / 2 "}$ Fabric B strip, right sides together (Diagram 10). Sew across the diagonal of the small square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Diagram 10). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle $1 / 4$ " away from the sewn seam (Diagram 11).

6. Follow Diagram 12 for the seam direction to add a 2 " Fabric $J$ square to the upper right corner of the $31 / 2 " \times 41 / 2 "$ Fabric B strip to make (1) Unit 7 strip (Diagram 13).
7. Repeat Steps 5-6 to make (8) Unit 7 ' strips total.

8. Repeat Steps $5-6$ and refer to Diagrams $14-18$ for fabric identification, placement, seam direction and orientation to make (8) of each unit strip for Unit 8 through Unit 12.

9. Following the manufacturer's instructions, trace the listed number of each template onto the paper side of the fusible web. Roughly cut out each template about $1 / 8$ " outside the drawn lines.
10. Press each template onto the wrong side of the fabrics as listed on the templates. Cut out each template on the drawn lines.
11. Refer to Diagram 19 to arrange and press (1) Fabric $C$ leaf onto (1) $31 / 2 "$ Fabric J square.
12. Finish the raw edges of each shape with a decorative stitch such as a buttonhole or satin stitch to make (1) Unit 13 square.
13. Repeat Steps $11-12$ to make (48) Unit 13 squares total.

14. Sew (1) Unit 13 square to each end of (1) Unit 77 strip to make the top row. Repeat to make the bottom row. Sew (1) Unit 7 strip to each side of (1) Unit 1 square to make the middle row. Sew together the (3) rows lengthwise to make (1) 10 12" Unit 14 square (Diagram 20). Repeat to make a second Unit 14 square.

16. Sew (1) $1^{1 / 2 "} \times 101 / 2$ "

Fabric J strip to each side of (1) Unit 14 square. Sew (1)
$11 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 12^{1 / 2 "}$ Fabric J strip to the top and to the bottom of the Unit 14 square to make (1) $121 / 2 "$ Block One square (Diagram 26). Repeat to make a second Block One square.

18. Place (1) $31 / 2 "$ Fabric L square on the top left corner of (1) $61 / 2$ " Fabric K square, right sides together (Diagram 32). Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Diagram 32). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle $1 / 4$ " away from the sewn seam (Diagram 33).

19. Follow Diagram 34 for the seam direction to add a $31 / 2 "$ Fabric L square to each of the remaining corners of the $61 / 2 "$ Fabric K square to make (1) Unit 20 square (Diagram 35).
20. Repeat Steps 18-19 to make (6) Unit 20 squares total.

21. Sew (1) $31 / 2 " \times 61 / 2 "$ Fabric J strip to each side of (1) Unit 20 square. Sew (1) $31 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 121 / 2 "$ Fabric J strip to the top and to the bottom of the Unit 20 square to make (1) $121 / 2$ " Block Seven square (Diagram 36). Repeat to make (6) Block Seven squares total.
22. Sew (1) 18 1⁄" " Fabric J triangle to each side of (1) Block One square. Sew (1) $93 / 8 "$ Fabric J triangle to the top of the Block One square to make Row One (Diagram 37).
23. Sew together (1) 18 1/4" Fabric J triangle, (1) Block Two square, (1) Block Seven square, (1) Block Three square and (1) $181 / 4 "$ Fabric J triangle, in that order from left to right, to make Row Two (Diagram 37).
24. Sew together (1) $181 / 4$ " Fabric J triangle, (1) Block Four square, (1) Block Seven square, (1) Block Five square, (1) Block Seven square, (1) Block Four square and (1) $93 / 8$ " Fabric J triangle, in that order from left to right, to make Row Three (Diagram 37).
25. Sew together (1) $93 / 8$ " Fabric J triangle, (1) Block Three square, (1) Block Seven square, (1) Block Six square, (1) Block Seven square, (1) Block Six square and (1) $181 / 4$ " Fabric J triangle, in that order from left to right, to make Row Four (Diagram 37).
26. Sew together (1) $181 / 4$ " Fabric J triangle, (1) Block One square, (1) Block Seven square, (1) Block Five square and (1) $181 / 4$ " Fabric J triangle, in that order from left to right, to make Row Five (Diagram 37).

2'7. Sew (1) 18 1/4" Fabric J triangle to each side of (1) Block Two square. Sew (1) $93 / 8$ " Fabric J triangle to the bottom of the Block Two square to make Row Six (Diagram 37).
28. Sew together the (6) rows from Steps 22-27, lengthwise and in numerical order from top to bottom, to make the Center Block (Diagram 37).


## Quilt Top Assembly

## (Refer to the Quilt Layout when assembling the quilt top.)

29. Measure the sides of the Center Block. Sew (4) $21 / 2 " \times$ WOF Fabric J strips together end to end with diagonal seams. Cut (2) strips to the measured sides of the Center Block and sew (1) strip to each side of the Center Block.
30. Measure the top and bottom of the Center Block. Sew (3) $21 / 2$ " x WOF Fabric J strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) strips to the top and bottom measurement. Sew the top and bottom strips to the top and bottom of the Center Block.
31. Repeat Steps 29-30 and refer to the quilt layout while using the ( 7 ) $11 / 2$ " x WOF Fabric M strips and (8) $21 / 2$ " x WOF Fabric $J$ strips to make the quilt top.

## Finishing the Quilt

32. Layer and quilt as desired.
33. Sew the (7) Fabric Ebinding strips together, end to end with a 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in halflengthwise with wrong sides together and press.
34. Bind as desired.

## Making the Pillows

## 35. Pillow Assembly

Place (1) 2" Fabric B square on the top left corner of (1) $61 / 2 "$ Fabric A square, right sides together (Diagram 39). Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Diagram 39). Flip open the triangle formed and press (Diagram 40). Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle $1 / 4$ " away from the sewn seam.

36. Follow Diagram 41 for the seam direction to add a 2 " Fabric B square to each of the remaining corners of the $61 / 2$ " Fabric A square to make (1) Unit 21 square (Diagram 42).

3\%. Repeat Steps 35-36 and refer to Diagram 43 for fabric identification, placement, seam direction and orientation to make (1) Unit 22 square.

38. Place (1) $23 / 4$ " Fabric D square on the top left corner of (1) 5 " $\times 61 / 2$ " Fabric B strip, right sides together (Diagram 44). Sew across the diagonal of the small square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Diagram 44). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle $1 / 4$ " away from the sewn seam (Diagram 45).
39. Follow Diagram 46 for the seam direction to add a $2^{3 / 4}$ " Fabric D square to the upper right corner of the 5" $\times 61 / 2$ " Fabric B strip to make (1) Unit 23 strip (Diagram 47).
40. Repeat Steps 38-39 to make (4) Unit 23 strips total.
41. Repeat Steps $38-39$ and refer to Diagram 48 for fabric identification, placement, seam direction and orientation to make (4) Unit 24 strips.

42. Following the manufacturer's instructions, trace the listed number of each template onto the paper side of the fusible web. Roughly cut out each template about $1 / 8$ " outside the drawn lines.

44. Refer to Diagram 49 to arrange and press (1) Fabric C leaf onto (1) 5" Fabric D square.
45. Finish the raw edges of each shape with a decorative stitch such as a buttonhole or satin stitch to make (1) Unit 25 square.
46. Repeat Steps $44-45$ to make (8)

## Bright Blooms

47. Sew (1) Unit 25 square to each end of (1) Unit 23 strip to make the top row. Repeat to make the bottom row. Sew (1) Unit 23 strip to each side of (1) Unit 21 square to make the middle row. Sew together the (3) rows lengthwise to make (1) $151 / 2$ " Unit 26 square (Diagram 50).
48. Repeat Step 47 and refer to Diagram 51 for component identification, placement and orientation to make (1) Unit 27 square.

49. Sew (1) 3 " $\times 15^{1 / 2 "}$ Fabric $D$ strip to each side of (1) Unit 26 square. Sew (1) 3" x $201 / 2 "$ Fabric D strip to the top and to the bottom of the Unit 26 square to make (1) 20 ½" Pillow \#1 top (Diagram 52).

50. Repeat Step 49 and refer to Diagram 53 for component identification, placement and orientation to make (1) Pillow \#2 top.

51. Turn under the $201 / 2$ " edge (1) $141 / 2^{\prime} \times 201 / 2 "$ Fabric D strip approximately $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$, press and repeat to make a finished edge on one edge of the Fabric D strip. Repeat with the second $141 / 2 " \times 201 / 2$ " Fabric D strip.
52. Position and pin each back envelope flap, right sides together with the Pillow \#1 front, overlapping the finished edges in the middle and aligning the raw edges with the pillow front (Diagram 54). Stitch around the pillow front and back to complete the Pillow \#1.
