Quilt finishes 72" x 72" Acorn Block: 19" x 19" 6 Block X: 11" x 11" 6 Block Y: 11" x 11" 36 Block Z: 6" x 6"

Luscious floral prints in autumn colors with a touch of blue make this double comforter/wall quilt a delight. The medallion-style design honors the humble acorn in the center, surrounded by easy to piece borders.

### **Cutting Directions**

**Note:** Read assembly directions before cutting patches. All measurements are cut sizes and include  $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowances. A fat  $\frac{1}{8}$  is a 9" x 20"-22" cut of fabric. A fat  $\frac{1}{4}$  is an 18" x 20"-22" cut. Borders are cut the exact lengths required plus  $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowances. WOF designates the width of fabric from selvedge to selvedge (approximately 42" wide). Note: Two more Block X and two more Block Y can replace the center Acorn Block if you desire.

#### **Acorn Block**

Cut Fabric G patches as listed Cut (28) scrappy squares 2½"

Cut (2) scrappy squares 3'' ( $2\frac{1}{8}$ ") for the bottom HST

#### ONE Block X or Block Y

Cut (9) scrappy squares 2"

Cut patches as listed for Fabrics H, N, and I or B

#### **ONE Block Z**

Cut (5) scrappy squares 2½"

Cut (4) squares 21/2" from Fabric G or Fabric L

#### Fabric A

Cut (9) squares 5" (41/8") for HST (Read Step 12 before cutting)

#### Fabric B

Cut (12) squares  $6\frac{1}{2}$ ", cut in half diagonally to make 24 triangles for block Y

Cut squares 2½" as desired for acorn block

#### Fabric C

Cut (34) squares 5" (41/8") for HST for Border 6

#### Fabric D

Cut (4) squares 5" (47/8") for HST

Cut squares 21/2" as desired for acorn block

**Backing** 

Cut (1) rectangle  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $12\frac{1}{2}$ " for acorn top

Cut (1) stripe  $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " for acorn stem

Cut squares 2" and 2½" as desired for blocks

#### Fabric F

Cut (2) top/bottom borders  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $64\frac{1}{2}$ " (border 5)

Cut (2) side borders 21/2" x 601/2"

Cut squares 2" and 2½" as desired for blocks

#### Fabric G

Cut (1) square 14", cut in half diagonally to make 2 triangles for acorn

Cut (1) square 10", cut in half diagonally to make 2 triangles for acorn

Cut (2) rectangles 3½" x 6" for acorn

Cut (2) rectangles  $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $12\frac{1}{2}$ " for acorn

Cut (2) squares 3'' ( $2\frac{1}{8}$ ") for acorn HST

Cut (4) squares 1½" for acorn

Cut (72) squares 21/2" for block Z

#### Fabric H

Cut (7) squares 5" (47/8") for HST Cut (48) rectangles 2" x 5" for blocks X and Y

#### Fabric I

Cut (12) squares 6½", cut in half diagonally to make 24 triangles for block X Cut (7) squares 5" (4¾") for HST

#### Fabric J

Cut (2) t/b borders  $2'' \times 22\frac{1}{2}''$  for border 1 Cut (2) side borders  $2'' \times 19\frac{1}{2}''$ Cut squares 2'' and  $2\frac{1}{2}''$  as desired for blocks

#### Fabric K

Cut (2) t/b borders  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $48\frac{1}{2}$ " for border 3 Cut (2) side borders  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $44\frac{1}{2}$ " Cut squares 2" and  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " as desired for blocks

#### Fabric L

Cut (72) squares  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " for block Z

#### Fabric M

Cut (4) squares 5'' (47'8'') for HST Cut squares 2'' and 21'2'' as desired for blocks

#### Fabric N

Cut (48) squares 2" for blocks X and Y Cut squares 2½" as desired for block Z

#### Fabric O

Cut (5) squares 5" (41/8") for HST Cut squares 2" and 21/2" as desired for blocks

#### 13 Fat 1/8

Cut a total of 108 squares 2'' (\*approx. 6-10 from each) Cut a total of 180 squares  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " (\*approx. 12-15 from each) \*Cut fewer or more from each fabric as you desire

#### **Binding**


Cut (8) strips 21/2" x WOF for binding


#### **Backing**

Cut (2) panels 40" x 80", pieced to fit quilt top with overlap on all sides


# **Making the Quilt**


- that finish 2" square for the bottom of the acorn. Cut 2
  Fabric G and 2 scrappy squares 3" for HST that will be
  trimmed after stitching. If you prefer not to trim, cut
  squares 21%". Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of
  Fabric G squares. Place a marked square on a scrappy
  square, right sides together. Sew 1/4" seam on each side of
  the marked line; cut apart on the marked line. Press open
  to make pieced HST. Trim to 21/2" if needed. Repeat with
  the other scrappy square. You will use only one of each
  color of HST. Set these aside.
- 2. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of the 4 Fabric G 1½" squares. Place a marked square on the Fabric E 3½" x 12½" rectangle, aligning raw edges at one corner. Stitch on the drawn line (Diagram 2). Trim away and discard excess fabric. Press open. Repeat this process on each corner to make the acorn top.
- 3. Referring to the Acorn Block diagram, arrange 28 scrappy 2½" squares and the 2 HST from Step 1 in 6 rows as shown. Once you are satisfied with the arrangement, join the squares into rows, and then join the rows. Sew Fabric G strips to the sides.
- **4.** Sew the acorn top to the unit. Sew Fabric G  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x 6" rectangles to each side of the Fabric E stem. Sew this unit to the top. The acorn should measure  $12\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $18\frac{1}{2}$ ".






- **5.** Mark the center of the long sides of the 10" and 14" Fabric G triangles. Matching centers, sew the 10" triangles to the top and bottom of the block. Trim the points that stick out even with the sides of the acorn. Again matching centers, sew the 14" triangles to the sides.
- **6.** The block is oversized and must be trimmed. Make a 19½" square pattern using graph paper, newsprint, or freezer paper, taping paper as needed to make the square. Position the paper pattern on top of the acorn unit, shifting so part of the Fabric G patches at the corners of the acorn will get trimmed, but none of the colored part of the acorn will be cut. Refer to the quilt image. Once you are satisfied with the placement, press freezer paper or pin the pattern in place. Draw around the pattern lightly at the edges of the pattern. Remove the pattern. Before cutting, check that none of the acorn will be trimmed except in the background Fabric G areas. Be sure that the block measures 19½" square from drawn line to drawn line. Trim along the drawn lines. Set block aside.












Position all Block Z around the guilt, noting placement of the diagonally arranged patches. Once you are happy with the arrangement, join 8 blocks to make each side border, and 10 blocks for the top and bottom borders. Sew to the quilt.


11. Border 5: Sew Fabric F borders to the sides, and then to the top and bottom.

Block X - Make 6




Block Z Make 18 with G Make 18 with L

12. Border 6: Following directions in Step 1, make 68 HST using Fabric C 5" (47%") squares paired with the other 5" (47%") squares (Diagram 3). Trim the HST to 4½". Note that you will have a few more HST than are needed. Save them for another project. Arrange the HST around the quilt, noting that the Fabric C patches are on the outside. Pay attention to the placement of the diagonal seams to duplicate the design. Join the HST to make the side borders. Sew to the quilt. Join HST to make the top and bottom borders and sew to the quilt.



### Finishing the Quilt


**13.** Layer the quilt with batting and backing and baste. Quilt in the ditch around borders and block patches. Quilt around the acorn, and quilt the acorn background with stipple quilting. Bind to finish the quilt.
