# Star Bright Quilt 

Introducing Andover Fabrics new collection: AVALON by Andover Fabrics
Quilt designed by Janet Houts

Quilt finishes 72' x 72"
13 Block Y: 12' x 12''
12 Block Z: 12' $\times 12^{\prime \prime}$

Lovers of hummingbirds will find this fabric line a delight. Fussy-cutting the birds makes them the center of each small star. The two-block design has a more complex "rolling star" that alternates with a simpler star for a fresh and open look.

## Cutting Directions

Note: Read assembly directions before cutting patches. All measurements are cut sizes and include $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ seam allowances. A fat $1 / 8$ is a $9^{\prime \prime} \times 20^{\prime \prime}-22^{\prime \prime}$ cut of fabric. A fat $1 / 4$ is an $18^{\prime \prime} \times 20^{\prime \prime}-22^{\prime \prime}$ cut. Borders are cut the exact lengths required plus $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ seam allowances. WOF designates the width of fabric from selvedge to selvedge (approximately $43^{\prime \prime}$ wide).

## Fabric A

Cut (2) top/bottom borders $51 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 72^{1 / 2 \prime}$ ", cut lengthwise
Cut (2) side borders $51 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 621 / 2^{\prime \prime}$, cut lengthwise

## Fabric B

Fussy-cut (13) squares $31 / 2^{\prime \prime}$, centering each hummingbird

## Fabric C

Cut (12) squares $31 / 2^{\prime \prime}$

## Fabric D

Cut (96) rectangles $2^{\prime \prime} \times 31 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ for Flying Geese (FG)

## Fabric E

Cut (52) squares $31 / 2^{\prime \prime}$

## Fabric $F$

Cut (12) squares $41 / 4^{\prime \prime}$, cut in half diagonally twice to make 48 quarter-square triangles

## Fabric G

Cut (104) rectangles $2^{\prime \prime} \times 31 / 2^{\prime \prime}$
Cut (52) squares $2^{\prime \prime}$

## Fabric H

Cut (104) squares 2"

## Fabric I

Cut (7) strips $11 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF, pieced to make the following:
2 top/bottom borders $11 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 62^{1 / 2 \prime}$
2 side borders $11 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 601 / 2^{\prime \prime}$

## Fabric J

Cut (24) squares $41 / 4^{\prime \prime}$, cut in half diagonally twice to make 96 quarter-square triangles

## Fabric K

Cut (48) rectangles $2^{\prime \prime} \times 31 / 2^{\prime \prime}$

## Fabric L

Cut (100) squares $31 / 2^{\prime \prime}$
Cut (52) rectangles $2^{\prime \prime} \times 31 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ for FG
Cut (12) squares $41 / 4^{\prime \prime}$, cut in half diagonally twice to make 48 quarter-square triangles
Cut (240) squares $2^{\prime \prime}$
Binding
Cut (8) strips $2^{1 ⁄ 2 \prime} \times$ WOF for binding

## Backing

Cut (2) lengths $41^{\prime \prime} \times 82^{\prime \prime}$, pieced to fit quilt top with overlap on all sides

## Making the Quilt

1. Fast Flying Geese units are used in both blocks in this quilt. Draw a diagonal line on the 2" Fabric H squares. Position a marked square as shown on one end of a Fabric L $2^{\prime \prime} \times 31 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangle (Diagram 1). Stitch on the marked diagonal line. Cut away the excess fabric. Press the corner up. Repeat this step on the opposite end of the rectangle (Diagram 2). Make 52 Flying Geese like this.
2. Referring to the Little Star diagram, arrange 4 Flying Geese and Fabric G $2^{\prime \prime}$ squares around each Fabric B $3^{1 ⁄ 2} 2^{\prime \prime}$ square, rotating the Flying Geese as shown. Join the parts to make 13 Little Stars.
3. To make a Block Y, arrange a Little Star with the other patches in the order shown. Once you are satisfied with the arrangement, join the parts into 3 horizontal rows, and then join the rows. Make 13 Block Y.
4. Refer to Diagrams 1-2 to make 96 Flying Geese, using Fabric D rectangles and Fabric L 2" squares. Make 96 Flying Geese like this.
5. Join 2 Fabric J, 1 Fabric L, and 1 Fabric F 4¼" quarter-square triangles to make a square (Diagram 3). Hint: Press seam allowances toward the Fabric J triangles so the 2 halves will "butt" together easily. Make 48 units like this.

6. Refer to the Block Z diagram for this step. Arrange 8 Flying Geese from Step 4, 4 units from Step 5, Fabric L 2" and 31⁄2" squares, Fabric K rectangles, and a center Fabric C square as shown. Look through the wrong end of binoculars or through a camera to check that all the parts are in the correct orientation. Fabric F triangles should all be touching the center square. The Fabric D triangles in the Flying Geese should form a star design. Do not hurry this step. Once you are satisfied, join the parts into 3 horizontal rows, and then join the rows. Make 12 Block Z like this.
7. Referring to the Quilt Assembly, arrange the blocks alternately in 5 rows of 5 blocks each. Note that rows 1, 3, and 5 are pieced the same, and rows 2 and 4 are alike. Join the blocks into rows, and then join the rows.
8. Sew the shorter Fabric I borders to the sides of the quilt, and longer borders to the top and bottom. Repeat with Fabric A borders.

## Finishing the Quilt

9. Layer the quilt with batting and backing and baste. Quilt in the ditch around borders and patches. Quilt around the printed motifs as you wish. Bind to finish the quilt.
