

Quilt finishes 72" x 96" 12 Blocks: 24" x 24"

Join in the holiday spirit when you make this lively topper/throw. The black prints add a dynamic sophistication to the green and red stars. Made entirely with easy half-square triangles, the piecing is exceptionally easy. The quilt should appeal to the traditionalist who is looking for a modern update.

#### **Cutting Directions**

**Note:** Read assembly directions before cutting patches. WOF designates the width of fabric from selvedge to selvedge (approximately 42" wide).

Fabric A	Cut (36) squares $4\%$ (or $5$ ")
	Read Step 1 before cutting

<b>Fabric B</b> Cut (42) squares 47/8" (or 5")
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**Fabric F** Cut (24) squares 47/8" (or 5")

**Fabric G** Cut (24) squares 4\%" (or 5")

**Fabric H** Cut (24) squares 47/8" (or 5")

**Fabric I** Cut (24) squares 47/8" (or 5")

**Fabric J** Cut (42) squares 4%" (or 5")

**Fabric K** Cut (24) squares 47/8" (or 5")

**Fabric L** Cut (36) squares 4\%" (or 5")

**Fabric M** Cut (42) squares 47/8" (or 5")

**Fabric N** Cut (24) squares 4\(^{y}\)squares 4\(^{y}\)squ


**Binding** Cut (9) strips 2½" x WOF for binding

**Backing** Cut (2) panels 40" x 104", pieced to fit quilt top with overlap on all sides

### **Making the Quilt**


1. The quilt is made entirely with half-square triangles (HST) that finish 4" square. Use your favorite method to make HST, or follow these directions. Cut squares 5" for HST that will be trimmed after stitching. If you prefer not to trim, cut squares 47%". Refer to the Block Unit diagrams to combine fabric squares into pairs. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of the lighter square in each pair (Diagram 1). Place the marked square on the second square, right sides together. Sew 1/4" seam on each side of the marked line; cut apart on the marked line. Press open to make pieced HST. Make the number of HST needed for each unit.


- 2. Referring to the Block Unit diagrams, join 9 HST in 3 rows in the order shown. Make 12 units alike for Block W. Repeat these steps to make 12 units for Blocks X, Y, and Z.
- **3.** Referring to the Block diagram, join 4 of the same unit to make a block, rotating the units as shown so the red triangles meet in the center. Make 3 Block W, 3 Block X, 3 Block Y, and 3 Block Z.









4. Arrange the blocks in 4 horizontal rows of 3 blocks each, noting block placement in the Quilt Diagram. Once you are satisfied with the placement, join the blocks in rows, and then join the rows.

#### Finishing the Quilt

5. Layer the quilt with batting and backing and baste.

Quilt in the ditch around block patches, or quilt an overall pattern. Bind to finish the quilt.



**Quilt Diagram** 


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
