## **Fabric Requirements**

Yardage Fabric Fabric A appliqué 1 yard 5703-T

14 Prints appliqué Fat <sup>1</sup>/<sub>8</sub> yard ea. 4116-B3, 4116-B4, 4116-C, 4116-C2, 4116-T1, 4116-T2, 4116-Y1, 4116-WW, 5703-W, 5978-B, 5978-W, 5979-B 5979-T, 5979-W

4 Prints appliqué Fat <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> yard ea. 5703-B, 5976-W, 5978-T, 5980-T

8 Prints blocks 1 yard ea. 4116-B2, 5976-B, 5976-T, 5977-B, 5977-TB, 5977-W, 5980-B, 5980-W

Backing 5 yards 5978-T

## **Cutting Directions**

#### Note: Read assembly directions before cutting patches.

Measurement for squares is cut size and includes  $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance. Measurement for circles is finished size. A fat  $\frac{1}{8}$  is a 9" x 20"-22" cut of fabric. A fat  $\frac{1}{4}$  is an 18" x 20"-22" cut. WOF designates the width of fabric from selvedge to selvedge (approximately 42" wide).

#### Note: Cut a total of 56 circles 8" diameter

| Fabric A | Cut (8) strips $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF for binding |

|          | Cut (4) 8" circles                                |

- Fat <sup>1</sup>/<sub>8</sub> prints From each: Cut (1 or 2) 8" circles
- Fat <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> prints From each: Cut (3 or 4) 8" circles
- **1 yard prints** From each: Cut (7) squares 10<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" x 10<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" Cut (1, 2, 3, or 4) 8" circles
- **Backing** Cut (2) panels 39" x 88", pieced to fit quilt top with overlap on all sides

Construct this celestial quilt for your favorite stargazer. Fused circles decoratively stitched onto background squares make the quilt simple enough for anyone. Have fun arranging the various heavenly prints to your satisfaction.

## Making and Assembling the Quilt

 Yardage is sufficient to allow flexibility in cutting the appliqué circles. If there is a fabric you especially like, cut more patches from it and fewer from other fabrics. If you wish to make the quilt exactly, cut the number of circles from each fabric as shown in the photograph.

Follow manufacturer's directions for lightweight fusible webbing. On the paper-side of fusible webbing draw (56) 8"-diameter circles. Roughly cut the paper circles out and press to the wrong side of the appropriate fabrics. Cut the fabric circles along the lines. Remove the paper backing. Position a circle on the center of each  $10\frac{1}{2}$ " square. Press the circles in place. Finish the edges with a decorative machine stitch using contrasting thread, or use an invisible thread with a blind appliqué machine stitch.

2. Refer to the Quilt Diagram. On a large flat surface, arrange the blocks into 8 rows of 7 blocks each. Feel free to arrange the blocks as you wish or place the same 10<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" background squares in a row. Once you are happy with the arrangement, join the blocks into rows. Press the seam allowances in opposite directions in alternating rows. Join the rows. Press the seam allowances in one direction.

## Finishing the Quilt

**3.** Layer the quilt with batting and backing and baste. Quilt in the ditch around blocks and circles. Quilt around the printed motifs if desired. Bind to finish the quilt.


## **Constellations Quilt**




Quilt Diagram

### **Circle Template**

**Note:** Some printers have a default printing setting at 95% of actual size. Make sure your printer is set at 100%. Measure template pieces after printing to check the size of each.
