





Cutting For Hexagons




1) Place your hexagon on the cutting mat to see what size strip you need to cut. In this case, a 1-1/2" hexagon will take a 3-1/2" strip.






- 2) Place your hexagons on the cut strip and allow 1/4" to 1/2" from the top and bottom of the piece.
- 3) After cutting the strips, use your ruler and sub cut the strips into 3-1/2" Squares. Sub cutting into hexagon shapes can be done *but is not necessary*.

Cutting For Half Hexagons



1) Place your half hexagon on the cutting mat to see what size strip you need to cut. In this case, a 1-1/2" half hexagon will take a 2" strip.




- 2) Place your half hexagons on the cut strip and allow 1/4" to 1/2" from the top and bottom of the piece.
- 3) After cutting the strips, use the 60 degree angle for the half hexagons on your ruler and sub cut the strips into half hexagon shapes.


Whip Stitching Straight Edges


After you have a number of pieces basted you can start whipping them together. With a matching thread, bury the knot between the paper piece and the seam allowance. If sewing a dark and light colored piece together, match the thread to the darker color.






Take two anchoring stitches when starting and whip stitch until you reach the next corner. Do not sew through the paper when joining the pieces. Your needle should slide next to the paper between the edge of the paper piece and the fabric, just catching the edge of the fabric.







We recommend about 6-10 stitches per inch. When you reach the "corner", secure it by taking two stitches together. If your whip stitchs are showing on the right side of the fabric, tighten the stitch slightly and catch less fabric. The stitching should be taut and even, but not pulling. Continue whipping pieces together to finish the block.

Removing the Papers

You can remove the papers once a piece is surrounded on all sides. Carefully pull the basting threads and remove the papers from the back side. These papers can be used again.

For the outer edges, press carefully while the papers are still in. This will help the fabric keep the shape of the paper piece. Once all of the edges are pressed, gently pull out the basting stitches and remove the papers from the back side keeping the shape with the seam allowance folded under. It is a good idea to run a basting stitch along the edge to keep the seam allowance folded under.

Adding Borders Squaring It Off

To add a straight border you must first trim the edges of your quilt top. Remove all the pieces and press the outside seam allowances flat. Take your rotary cutter and ruler and trim all the edges to get a straight line a 1/4" away from the edge.



1) Line up your ruler 1/4" from the edge of the top.




2) Trim the excess.





3) Remove cut pieces and continue for all sides of the quilt top.


Adding Borders Cutting The Borders

Once your quilt top is squared off, measure the long side of your quilt. Add 4" to this number to get the total for your long borders. Cut two borders this size. Match the middles of the borders with the middle of the quilt top and pin borders in place. Sew them to your quilt top (Fig. 1). Repeat the process for the short borders. (Fig. 2). Once both sets of borders are attached, square off the corners and trim away any excess bulk from behind. (Fig. 3).

Batting	57" x 62"
Binding	1/2 yard

Cutting Instructions

Pieces **Note: A strip is considered the width of the fabric from selvage to selvage.

Hexagons:

Teal Knit (A-7616-EG): Cut four 3-1/2" Strips.

Sub cut into 40 squares.

Gray Knit (A-7616-EC): Cut three 3-1/2" Strips.

Sub cut into 24 squares.

Blue Knit (A-7615-B): Cut four 3-1/2" Strips.

Sub cut into 41 squares.

Pink Knit (A-7616-BP): Cut ten 3-1/2" Strips.

Sub cut into 107 squares.

Green Knit (A-7616-BG): Cut seven 3-1/2" Strips.

Sub cut into 69 squares.

Castle (A-7618-N): Cut one 3-1/2" Strips.

Sub cut into 1 square.

Downton Writing (A-7617-N): Cut nineteen 3-1/2" Strips.

Sub cut into 201 Hexagons.

Half Hexagons:

Downton Writing(A-7617-N): Cut two 2" Strips.

Sub cut into 23 Half Hexagons.

Binding Cut (6) 1-1/2" strips.

Cut (6) 2-1/2" strips.

- 1) Baste the fabric to the Paper Pieces according to the basic instructions.
- 2) Sew the following flowers together (Fig. 1 Fig. 10):




Fig. 5 1 Blue Knit Center 6 Green Knit Petals 1 Green Knit Petal Make 5





5) Sew the green and teal flowers, Fig. 2 - 4, to the center flower of Fig. 1. Be sure to watch the placement of the flowers to make sure the Downton Writing is in the bottom right corner.






Fig.26 Center (Fig.1) with Fig. 2 - 4 attached

6) Sew the green and blue flowers, Fig.5, and the Downton Writing flower, Fig.6, to Fig.26. Be sure to watch the placement of the flowers to make sure the Downton Writing is in the bottom right corner.



7) Add the rows made in Fig. 11 - 13 to Fig.27.



8) Sew the following flowers together into sets:






9) Add six gray knit hexagons as shown to center Fig.31.






Fig. 32 Center (Fig. 31) Fig. 29 - 30 attached

10) Attach five Fig.30 and 1 Fig. 29 to the center of Fig.31 (Fig.32).

11) Add five gray knit and one castle hexagon to the center.

12) Sew the Downton Writing rows together to make the left and right sides of the quilt. (Fig.34-35)





Fig. 36 Left and Right Sides attached to Center.

13) Sew left and right sides, Fig.34-35, to center, Fig.33 (Fig. 36).

14) Sew remaining Downton Writing rows, Fig. 25, to the top and bottom of Fig. 36 (Fig. 37).

- 15) Remove papers. See instructions on page 4.
- 16) Trim the edges of your quilt. See instructions on Squaring It Off on page 4.
- 17) Add borders. See instructions on page 5.
- 18) Layer finished top, batting and backing. Quilt as desired.
- 19) Bind and enjoy!
