

4 Block W: 8" x 8" • 12 Block Y: 8" x 8"

4 Block X: 8" x 8" • 12 Block Z: 8" x 8"

The witticisms of the Dowager Countess of Downton Abbey, played by Dame Maggie Smith, are on display in this wall quilt. Made with the subtle colors suitable for Lady Grantham's elegant wardrobe, the quilt will bring a smile of recognition to fans of the PBS series.

Cutting Directions

Note: Read assembly directions before cutting patches. All measurements are cut sizes and include 1/4" seam allowances. Borders are cut the exact lengths required plus 1/4" seam allowances. WOF designates the width of fabric from selvedge to selvedge (approximately 42" wide).

Fabric A Fussy-cut (7) squares 8 1/2" x 8 1/2", centering text

Fabric B Cut (4) squares 4 1/2" x 4 1/2"
Cut (48) rectangles 2 1/2" x 4 1/2"

Fabric C Cut (16) squares 4 1/2" x 4 1/2"

Fabric D Cut (7) strips 2 1/2" x WOF for binding

Fabric E Cut (8) squares 4 7/8" x 4 7/8", cut in half diagonally to make 16 half-square triangles
Cut (12) squares 4 1/2" x 4 1/2"

Fabric F Cut (48) squares 2 1/2" x 2 1/2"

Fabric G Cut (8) squares 4 7/8" x 4 7/8", cut in half diagonally to make 16 half-square triangles
Cut (48) squares 2 1/2" x 2 1/2"

Fabric H Cut (2) side borders 4 1/2" x 64 1/2", cut lengthwise
Cut (2) t/b borders 4 1/2" x 56 1/2", cut lengthwise

Fabric I Cut (48) rectangles 2 1/2" x 4 1/2"

Fabric J Cut (2) side borders 2 1/2" x 42 1/2", cut crosswise and pieced
Cut (2) t/b borders 2 1/2" x 30 1/2", cut crosswise and pieced

Fabric K Cut (2) side borders 1 1/2" x 40 1/2", cut crosswise and pieced
Cut (2) t/b borders 1 1/2" x 26 1/2", cut crosswise and pieced
Cut (4) squares 5 1/4" x 5 1/4", cut in half diagonally twice to make 16 quarter-square triangles


Fabric L Cut (2) side borders 1 1/2" x 46 1/2", cut crosswise and pieced
Cut (2) t/b borders 1 1/2" x 32 1/2", cut crosswise and pieced
Cut (4) squares 5 1/4" x 5 1/4", cut in half diagonally twice to make 16 quarter-square triangles

Backing Cut (2) panels 40" x 64", pieced to fit quilt top with overlap on all sides

Fabric Requirements



Fabric A	blocks	1 panel (2/3 yard)	8109-N
Fabric B	blocks	5/8 yard	8110-K
Fabric C	blocks	3/8 yard	8110-P
Fabric D	binding	5/8 yard	8111-K
Fabric E	blocks	1/2 yard	8112-K
Fabric F	blocks	1/4 yard	8112-L
Fabric G	blocks	1/2 yard	8112-P
Fabric H	border	2 yards	8113-K
Fabric I	blocks	1/2 yard	8113-L
Fabric J	border	3/8 yard	8113-P
Fabric K	border	1/2 yard	8114-K
Fabric L	blocks	1/2 yard	8114-P
Backing		3 3/4 yards	8110-L

1. Referring to the Block W diagram, sew 4 Fabric K 5 1/4" triangles to each side of a Fabric B 4 1/2" square. Press all seam allowances away from center square. Sew Fabric E 4 7/8" triangles to the sides. Make 4 Block W like this.

2. Referring to the Block X diagram, join patches as in Step 1, using fabrics indicated. Make 4 Block X like this.





- Referring to the Block Y diagram, sew Fabric B rectangles to opposite sides of a Fabric E $4\frac{1}{2}$ " square. Join a Fabric F square to each end of 2 Fabric B rectangles. Sew these units to the top and bottom of the block center. Make 12 Block Y like this.
- Referring to the Block Z diagram, join patches as in Step 3, using fabrics indicated. Make 12 Block Z like this.
- Referring to the Quilt Diagram, arrange the W and X blocks with Fabric A squares as shown to make 5 horizontal rows of 3 blocks each. Join the blocks and squares, being careful to keep the printed words upright. Join the rows.




Block Z – Make 12

- Sew Fabric K, J, and L borders to the quilt in the order shown, sewing the longest border in each set to the sides first.
- Referring to the Quilt Diagram, arrange 3 Block Y and 3 Block Z to make a pieced border. Join the blocks. Make 4 borders alike. Sew borders to the sides first, turning them as shown. Sew remaining pieced borders to the top and bottom.
- Sew long Fabric H borders to the sides. Sew short borders to the top and bottom.

Finishing the Quilt

- Layer the quilt with batting and backing and baste. Quilt in the ditch around borders and block patches. Quilt around the printed motifs as desired. Bind to finish the quilt.
