- Make sure to visit http://www.makoweruk.com/projects/ to ensure you are working from the most up-to-date version of the pattern
- Makower UK provides the written instructions only to accompany the named collection. Retailers
  are free to use these free instructions to provide a fabric kit. Accurate cutting of fabric is down to
  the individual retailer and any fabric supply enquires should be directed to point of purchase
- · Read the pattern in full before starting
- 1/4" seams are used throughout except where stated otherwise
- · Press after each seam, pressing seams open or to one side as preferred
- WOF width of fabric a strip of fabric cut from selvedge to selvedge
- WOFQ width of fat quarter a strip of fabric cut from selvedge to centre cut from a FQ
- BKG background
- HST half square triangle
- EPP English Paper Piecing
- FPP Foundation Paper Piecing

#### Making the nine quilt blocks

#### Block 1

- 1. Draw a diagonal line on the back of two BKG1 3" squares
- 2. Pair these right sides together with two stripe 3" squares
- 3. Sew seam lines 1/4" either side of the diagonal lines
- 4. Cut into two along the diagonal lines
- 5. Press open and trim to 2 ½" square
- 6. This will make four 2" finished HSTs
- 7. Sew four 1 ½" x 2 ½" fussy cut fox strips to four BKG 1 ½" x 2 ½" strips
- 8. Sew the HSTs, strip sets and BKG1 2 ½" square into three rows of three, taking care with the orientation of the foxes
- 9. Sew the three rows together to finish the block

#### Block 2

- 1. Fussy cut four fox triangles using template A
- 2. Cut four mini blooms triangles using the same template
- 3. Cut two BKG1 4" squares in half along the diagonal
- 4. Sew the fox and mini blooms triangles into pairs along the diagonals
- 5. Sew those pieces into a four-patch taking care with the orientation of the foxes
- 6. Sew the BKG1 triangles to the four sides of the block and trim to 6 ½" square

#### Block 3


- Fussy cut three fox diamonds using template B cut to the dashed lines
- 2. Cut three pumpkins diamonds using the same template
- Trim the six templates to the solid lines to make EPP Piecing templates
- 4. Stitch or glue baste the six diamonds to these templates
- 5. Sew the six pieces together using a whip stitch
- 6. Press the whole piece and remove papers from the back by removing the basting stitches or peeling away from the glue
- 7. Hand or machine applique to the BKG1 6 ½" square

#### Block 4

FPP the economy square template using:

- 1. The mini blooms 3" square for section 1
- 2. Two 3" squares each cut in half on the diagonal for sections 2-5
- 3. Four owl triangles fussy cut using template A for sections 6-9
- 4. Two BKG1 4" squares each cut in half on the diagonal for sections 10-13
- 5. Trim the paper and fabric to the dashed lines
- 6. Remove papers from the back by tearing along the sewn lines









#### Block 5

- 1. Cut a pumpkin square using the C template
- 2. Fussy cut four owl triangles using the D template
- 3. Sew the four owl triangles to the four side of the pumpkins square taking care with the orientation of the owls
- 4. Draw a diagonal line on the back of two BKG1 2 ½" squares
- 5. Pair those right sides together with two strip 2 ½" squares
- 6. Sew seam lines 1/4" either side of the diagonal lines
- 7. Cut into two along the diagonal lines
- 8. Press open and trim to 2" square
- 9. This will make eight 1 ½" finished HSTs
- 10. Sew the HSTs into pairs following the orientation in the block diagram
- 11. Sew two of those pairs either side of the centre square
- 12. Sew BKG1 2" squares to each end of the other two pairs and sew those to the top and bottom of the strip made at the previous step

#### Block 6

- 1. Fussy cut four owl triangles using the E templates
- 2. Cut four mini blooms triangles using the same template
- 3. Sew the triangles into pairs along the diagonal
- 4. Sew those pieces into a four-patch taking care with the orientation of the owls
- 5. Sash the sides of the block with two BKG1 ½" x 4 ½" strips
- 6. Sash the top and bottom of the block with two BKG1  $1\frac{1}{2}$ " × 6  $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips

#### Block 7

- 1. Draw a diagonal line on the back of two BKG1 2 1/2" squares
- 2. Pair these right sides together with two pumpkin 2 ½" squares
- 3. Sew seam lines 1/4" either side of the diagonal lines
- 4. Press open and trim to 2" square
- 5. Cut into two along the diagonal lines
- 6. This will make eight 1 ½" finished HSTs
- 7. Sew the HSTs into pairs following the orientation in the block diagram
- 8. Sew two of those pairs either side of the centre square
- 9. Sew BKG1 2" squares to each end of the other two pairs and sew those to the top and bottom of the strip made at the previous step

#### Block 8

- 1. Trace four of the F template onto the paper side of a sheet of fusible web (trace the dashed lines)
- 2. Fuse to the back of the scenic fabric, taking care to align the motifs within the solid line shape and taking care with the orientation of each of the four shapes
- 3. Fuse the F template shapes to four BKG1 2 ½" squares aligning the straight dashed lines of those pieces with the edges of the fabric as shown in fig 1 (top of next page)
- 4. Stitch along the diagonal edges with a blanket, zigzag or other decorative stitch to secure











5. Sew the pieces made at the previous step, four BKG1 2 ½" squares and one foxes 2 ½" square into a nine patch by sewing the block into three rows then sewing those three rows together










#### Block 9


- 1. Cut 1 3/4\* WOFQ strips from each of the pumpkin and mini blooms fabrics and cut each into four G templates
- 2. Cut four BKG1 2 ½" squares and four BKG1 3" squares in half on the diagonal
- 3. Sew 2 ½\* BKG1 triangles to one side of the diamonds and then 3" BKG1 triangles to the adjacent side (see figs 2 and 3 above) the placement of these triangles will be in one orientation for the mini blooms diamonds and the opposite orientation for the pumpkins diamonds
- 4. Sew the triangles into pairs along the diagonal lines, sew those pairs together then sew the two halves of the quilt block together to finish

#### **Pumpkin Frames**

- You will make five pumpkin frames using fussy cut brown owls and orange mini blooms and five using leaf scatter and brown mini blooms
- 2. For each block, make four 2" finished BKG2 / mini blooms HSTs in the same way as you did for block 1
- 3. Sew two owls / leaf scatter 2 ½" squares and one mini blooms 2 ½" square into two columns and sew these to either side of one of the blocks 1-9 made above
- 4. Sew the HSTs made above, two owls / leaf scatter 2½" squares and one mini blooms 2½" square into two rows and sew those to the top and bottom of the block
- 5. The leaves and stems will be made from green leaf scatter and green mini blooms
- 6. Make two green / BKG1 1 ½" finished HSTs in the same way as you did for block 5
- 7. Sew BKG1 2" x 3 3/4" strips to the left side of one of these HSTs and one to the right side of the other
- 8. Sew BKG1 1" x 5 1/4" strips to the top of each of these pieces
- 9. Sew these two pieces either side of a green 1" x 2 ½" stem piece
- 10. Sew the stem sections to the top of the pumpkin sections







#### Assembling the quilt top

- 1. Sew the pumpkins into three rows of three pumpkins with BKG2 2 ½" x 12 ½" strips between them.
- 2. Sew those rows together with BKG2 1  $\frac{1}{2}$ " × 38  $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips between them.
- 3. Sash the sides of the quilt top with two of the BKG1 2 ½" x 38 ½" strips then the top and bottom with the remaining two BKG2 2 ½" x 38 ½\* strips
- 4. Sash the side of the quilt top with the scenic 4 1" x 42  $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips then the top and bottom with the scenic 4  $\frac{1}{2}$ " × 46  $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips to finish the quilt top.

#### Finishing the quilt

- 1. Sew the binding strips end to end using diagonal or straight seams as preferred and press wrong sides together along the length to make a double fold binding.
- 2. Make a quilt sandwich basting together the back, the wadding and the top. Quilt as desired then trim square, removing excess wadding and backing.
- 3. Bind, taking care to mitre the corners.


#### Making the table runner

- 1. Make blocks 4, 5 and 6 and add the pumpkin surrounds and leaf and stem tops.
- 2. Sash into a row of three pumkpins with BKG2 2 ½" × 12 ½" strips in between them and at each end.
- 3. Sash the top and bottom of the runner top with the BKG2 2  $\frac{1}{2}$ " × 38  $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips.
- 4. Sash the ends of the runner with the scenic 2  $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 16  $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips then the top and bottom with the scenic 2  $\frac{1}{2}$ " × 42  $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips.
- 5. Finish as for the quilt.


#### Making the cushions

- 1. Make blocks 7, 8 and 9 and add the pumpkin surrounds and leaf and stem tops.
- 2. Sash the sides of each pumpkin block with BKG2 2  $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 12  $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips then the top and bottom with the BKG2 1  $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 14  $\frac{1}{2}$ \* strips.
- 3. Sash the sides of each block with the scenic 2  $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 14  $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips then the top and bottom with the scenic 2  $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 18  $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips.
- 4. Sew the binding strips end to end using diagonal or straight seams as preferred and press wrong sides together along the length to make a double fold binding.
- 5. Baste together the wadding and the top of each cushion. Quilt as desired then trim square, removing excess wadding.
- 6. Hem one side of each of the backing pieces (for each cushion, the left side of one and the right side of the other).
- 7. Lay the narrower backing piece on top of the wider backing piece and place wrong sides together with the cushion front.
- 8. Zigzag around the outside to secure.
- 9. Bind each cushion, taking care to mitre corners.

Templates shold be printed at 100" oir "no scaling". Measure the dimension line to make sure they have printed at the rights scale



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
