



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

#### **Fabric Requirements**

FABRIC C	1786 / R	1786 / S	1786 / Q	20cms / 7 ½"	Three 2 ½" WOF strips
FABRIC D	1785 / R	1785 / S9	1785 / Q5	30cms / 10"	Four 2 ½" WOF strips
FABRIC E	1784 / R	1784 / S	1784 / Q	40cms /15"	Six 2 ½" WOF strips
FABRIC F	1789 / R2	1789 / S3	1780 / Q5	35cms / 12½"	Five 2 1/2" WOF strips



#### **Notes**

- Read the pattern in full before starting.
- ½" seams are used throughout except where stated otherwise.
- Press after each seam, pressing seams open or to one side as preferred.
- WOF = width of fabric a strip of fabric cut from selvedge to selvedge.
- Make sure to visit http://www.makoweruk.com/projects/ to make sure you are working from the most up-to-date version of the pattern.

#### **Cutting**


- 1. Cut the fabrics as set out in the fabric requirements schedule.
- 2. Cut the background fabric WOF strips into two 14" and two 19" squares and cut those squares in half on the diagonal.




#### **Making the Quilt Top**

- 1. Sew the strips into six groups of six strips, staggering the ends of the strips as shown in the diagram below by approximately 2" to 2 ½" and in the following groups.
- Strip 1: A, B, C, D, A, E
- Strip 2: B, C, D, A, E, F
- Strip 3: C, D, A, E, F, G
- Strip 4: D, A, E, F, G, H
- Strip 5: A, E, F, G, H, I
- Strip 6: E, F, G, H, I, J

2. Using the 45 degree line on your cutting mat, cut eight strips each 2 ½" wide (see diagram below)



- 3. Sew the strips into eight diamonds in the order strip 1, strip 2, strip 3, strip 4, strip 5 and strip 6 and following the layout in the fabric placement diagram.
- 4. NB: take care when sewing strips together to offset the seam ends as shown in the diagram below so that the seams meet at the point where the seam runs through.



- 5. Lay out the eight diamonds in pairs as shown in the fabric placement diagram. Sew the 19" half square triangles to the sides of the diamonds, trim and press then sew the 14" half square triangles to the adjacent side of the diamonds to make four pairs as shown in that diagram.
- 6. Sew those pieces into pairs. Sew those squares into pairs and then sew the two halves of the quilt top together to finish.


#### Finishing the guilt

- 1. Sew the binding strips end to end using diagonal or straight seams as preferred and press wrong sides together along the length to make a double fold binding.
- 2. Make a guilt sandwich, basting together the guilt back, the wadding and the guilt top.
- 3. Quilt as desired then trim the quilt square, removing excess wadding and backing. Long Arm Quilted by Trudi Wood from http://trudi-quiltingprolifically.blogspot.co.uk.
- 4. Bind the quilt taking care to mitre the corners.
